# Wastewater and Treatment Education Roundtable History

- WATER is an educational partnership between NCTCOG, municipalities, and water utilities in the North Central Texas region
- Formerly known as the North Texas
   Grease Abatement Council
- Started in 2005 with the goal to target grease related issues in North Central Texas and reduce SSOs
- Expanded with a new name and new mission in 2015





WATER's mission is to help reduce potential damage to the region's household plumbing systems and wastewater treatment systems as well as to decrease hazards to water quality through educational efforts related to the proper disposal of items such as

- wipes,
- paper towels,
- feminine hygiene and personal care products,
- medicines,
- household hazardous waste, and
- fats, oils, and grease (FOG).

#### Funding, Budget, and Participation

- Budget is funded through voluntary cost-shares, based on population size or customers served
- FY2022 Participation:
  - 17 city participants, serving a total population of approx. 2.1 million residents
    - Represents approx. 27% of the North Central Texas region
  - 2 special district participants, serving over 1 million customers each
- Annual Budget: \$57,200



- Paid instructors and municipal volunteer presenters, depending on direction received from members












#### Defend Your Drains North Texas

- Defend Your Drains and Cease the Grease messaging originated from the City of Dallas Water Utilities
- Dallas agreed to share logos and other assets with the region in 2016
- NCTCOG has expanded upon the original Defend Your Drains messaging since then
  - Including a new website, updated marketing deliverables, locator map, and more










#### Defend Your Drains North Texas Website

### Holiday Grease Roundup

- Annual FOG collection event during the Holiday season
- Started in 2014 through Dallas County Schools biodiesel program for buses
- Runs from mid-November through the first week in January
- Directed by WATER to offer this to the entire region, not just cost-sharing participants





### Holiday Grease Roundup Participation

- Entities can participate in the Holiday Grease Roundup in three ways:
  - Through their own established grease/FOG collection program,
  - Partnering with American
     BioSource for a grease container
     and collection, or
  - Only participating as a marketing partner, with no collection location.










### Holiday Grease Roundup Participation

Most collection locations are open to ALL North Central Texas residents, but some are restricted or are curbside pick-up only through established Household Hazardous Waste programs

- Most locations run for the entirety of the HGR (or are available yearround)
- Participants can also select specific days if their location cannot be available for the entirety of event

### Holiday Grease Roundup Program Growth

- In 2017, NCTCOG worked with members to find new partner to collect/utilize the grease
- Continue to expand participation and increase amount of FOG collected
- 2021 Holiday Grease Roundup included 41 participants and 70 drop off locations
  - Represents over 4.7 million residents
