

Regional Feral Hog Forum



The North Central Texas Council of Governments, along with the City of Dallas, and Texas Parks and Wildlife, is hosting a regional forum on the management of urban feral hogs in North Texas. This half day event will bring together environmental policy makers, experts, and interested parties from around the region to communicate and coordinate on feral hog issues. Presentation topics include an introduction to the feral hog issue, current regional efforts, legality issues, lessons learned, and an expert panel discussion and open forum. The goal of this event is to raise awareness and provide a foundational knowledge among the municipal decision makers in the DFW metroplex, and to begin to develop a plan of action to move forward in regional cooperation to more effectively manage feral hogs in North Texas.

City planners, facility managers and wildlife experts from state and local agencies from around the state and beyond gather to learn how we got here, what's going on currently and what could be done in the future.
