

Data Collection Form – Organized Event

- Estimated miles of roadway cleaned
- Estimated miles of waterways cleaned
- Estimated acres of parks cleaned
- Estimated miles of sidewalks/trails cleaned
- Drop-off station or site used for disposal of trash (Example: City Drop-off station, home trash can/cart, school dumpster, work place dumpster/trash can)

Do NOT use a dumpster without permission from the property owner - this is illegal dumping!




Doo the Right Thing Photo Contest




- Contest: July 1st August 31st


