SECO Audits use geographical information, utility data, and basic building characteristics to evaluate and report on a building's energy efficiency — without stepping foot inside.

### PRELIMINARY ENERGY ASSESSMENTS



Utilize free energy assessments to help identify and prioritize measures to reduce water and energy consumption.

# **TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE**



Get customized, on-site, energy and water efficiency-related services across a broad spectrum, ranging from basic consultation to feasibility studies. These services are provided at no cost to public entities.

## LOANSTAR REVOLVING LOAN PROGRAM



Get financing for energy-related, cost-reduction retrofits of facilities owned and occupied by the state, public school districts, public colleges and universities and public hospital taxing districts. Low-interest loan payments can be offset by energy cost savings, so no net new cost to the borrower.

SECO programs are offered to eligible public entities including K-12 schools, state and local governments, public colleges, county hospitals, local authorities and municipally-owned utilities.
