2. **2021 March is Texas SmartScape Month Reveal.** NCTCOG will share graphics and resources created for the 2021 March is Texas SmartScape Month campaign and invite members to share events happening this Spring.

4. **FY21 Work Project Update.** NCTCOG staff will update the group on the status of training webinars for the current fiscal year Work Program.

A webinar on the topic of <u>Healthy Creeks and Waterways –Vegetation and the Flow of Healthy Waterways</u> has been confirmed for the date of March 31st. For additional details, please visit the registration page. Planning efforts are ongoing for webinars on the topics of Low-Impact Design and Small Scale BMPs.

5. **Trash Free Waters Update.** NCTCOG will give an update on the status of the EPA Trash Free Waters project and activities.

A recap of the *Trash Free Texas Webinar: Connecting Volunteers with Litter Cleanup Locations* held on February 19, 2021, was given to the group. The presentation included a summarization of results from a statewide survey conducted on litter cleanup events distributed in December 2020. A <u>recording</u> of the webinar along with the <u>presentation</u> are available on NCTCOG's <u>Trash Free Waters</u> project webpage. NCTCOG staff also presented the results of several survey questions on the impact COVID-19 had on litter cleanup events and suggestions from the participants on how to adapt events to address concerns around safety. 6. **FY20 Work Project Update and Discussion.** NCTCOG staff will update the group on the status of the NCTCCC website and lead a discussion on potential dates for the Community Cleanup Challenge.

Updates to the website for the North Texas Community Cleanup Challenge were discussed, which includes educational content for residents and Toolbox resources such as Partner Resources and Downloads. Work on the website is ongoing and expected to be completed later this year. The group was polled for the selection of dates to hold the 2021 North Texas Community Cleanup Challenge. The group selected the option of September and October for the challenge period with no objections raised to holding the challenge this year. With the selection of dates made, NCTCOG staff will begin work on campaign resources for the group to support the cleanup challenge.

7. **FY22 Program Discussion.** NCTCOG staff will initiate a discussion on work project ideas for the Fiscal Year 2022 Work Program. Staff will also kick off initial discussions on slogan and/or visual ideas for the 2022 March is Texas SmartScape Month campaign.

NCTCOG staff gave a brief overview of the timeline for the FY22 Special Project selection process. Members are encouraged to share ideas for the FY22 special project for consideration and discussion at the next PETF meeting in April.

A brief discussion was also held on the FY22 March is Texas SmartScape Month campaign and supporting graphics the group would like to see developed for future campaigns. The group preferred to keep using pollinators, such as the Monarch and native bees, in graphics designed for the campaigns. Shots showing simple but easy to achieve ideas for beginner, intermediate and advanced gardeners were suggested for future graphics. The group also requested tight shots of flowerbeds showcasing perennials and pollinators.

OTHER BUSINESS AND ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION

8. **Other NCTCOG Program Updates.** NCTCOG staff will share recent and upcoming activities of the IDDE, Stormwater Monitoring, TMDL, and Wastewater and Treatment Education Roundtable, programs.

The Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE) Roundtable will meet on March 18, 2021 and will discuss upcoming training opportunities for FY21.

The Regional Wet Weather Characterization Program (RWWCP) is in the fourth year of the program term. They are in the Beginning phase of implementation of Best Management Practices Analysis and Evaluation Plan (BANEP). Program participants will meet with the program consultant and NCTCOG staff to discuss requested information needed for the BANEP worksheets.

The TMDL Wastewater Technical Subcommittee meeting will take place on January 28, 2021 at 9:30 AM via Microsoft Teams. The Upper Trinity River Basin Coordinating Committee will take place on February 9, 2021, at 9:30 AM via Microsoft Teams. The TMDL Coordination Committee Meeting will take place on July 1, 2021, at 9:30 AM, location to be determined.

A Virtual TMDL Calculations Workshop will be held in April with presentations from Jimmy Millican, TIAER, on calculating waste load allocations, load duration curves, and flow data. A presentation from TCEQ over TMDL benchmarks for Stormwater permits will also be given. Additional information, including registration, will be made available in the coming weeks.

The Wastewater and Treatment Education Roundtable (WATER) is currently accepting commitments online for the FY2021 Work Program. The FY2020 Work Program Summary for WATER is available online for review for those interested. The Holiday Grease Roundup hosted by WATER ended on January 4th, 2021. The results will be presented at their virtual meeting on March 10, 2021.


TRWD: will be presenting at the Urban Riparian Symposium, which is being hosted by the Texas Riparian Association from February $10^{th} - 12^{th}$.
