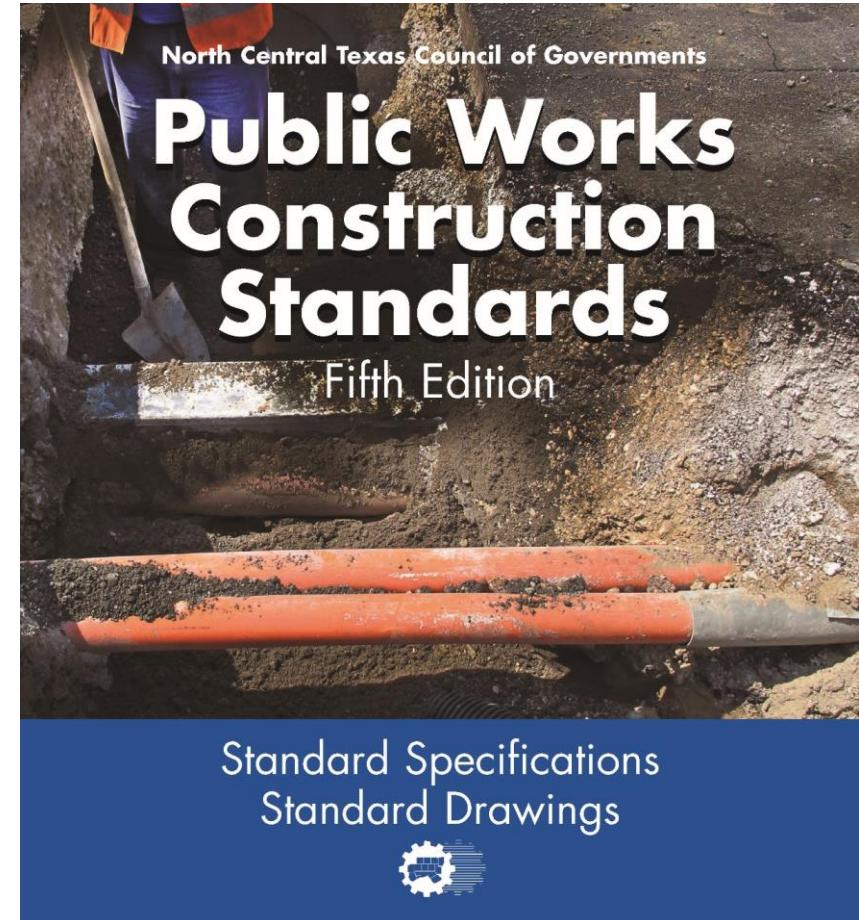

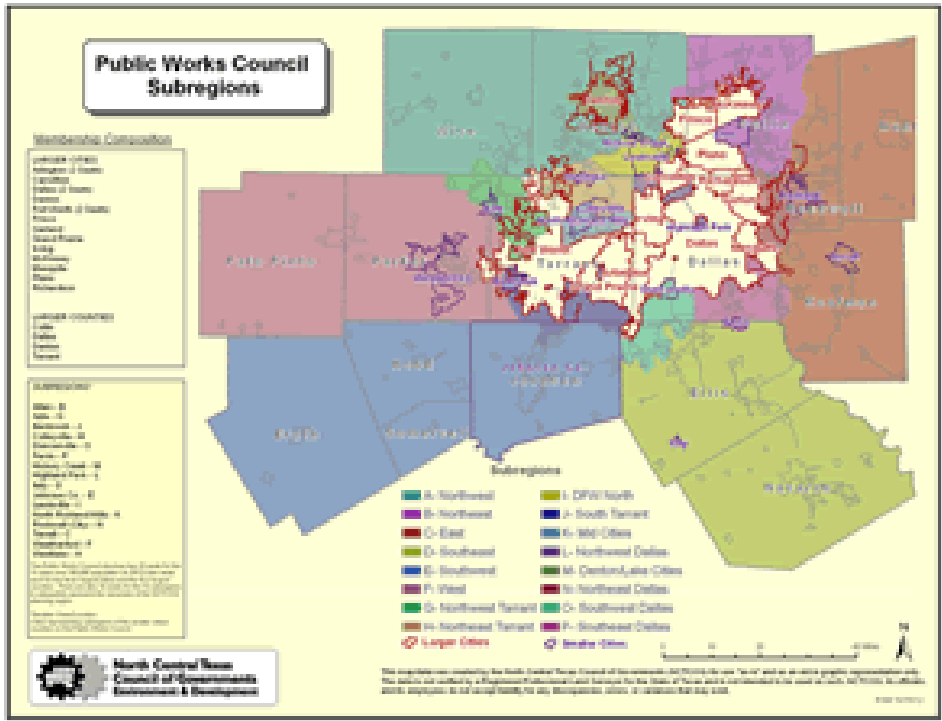

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

The current **PWC Structure** has 20 seats for the 13 cities with populations over 100,000 (two seats each for the three largest cities) and the four largest counties with populations over 400,000. It has 16 seats for 16 subregions to adequately represent the remainder of the NCTCOG planning region. The PWC has 5 private sector seats.

Key Note Speaker: Michael Ablon

Michael Ablon is a founding partner of PegasusAblon, a multidisciplinary developer and investor focused on the integration of emerging markets and evolving demographic trends. He led the redevelopment of the Dallas Design District from a warehouse/showroom district in the 1950-70s to a vibrant neighborhood of galleries, restaurants, and apartments, while maintaining the history, vibe, and character of the neighborhood.

Ablon will serve as Chairman of the Local Government Corporation for the Trinity River Corridor. The first major project for the LGC will be the development of a great central park, Harold Simmons Park.

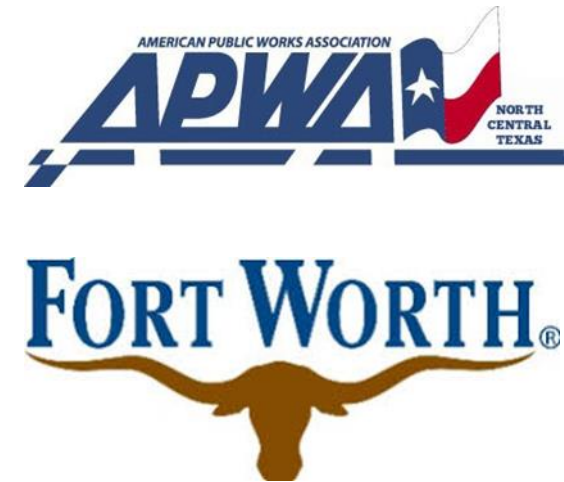
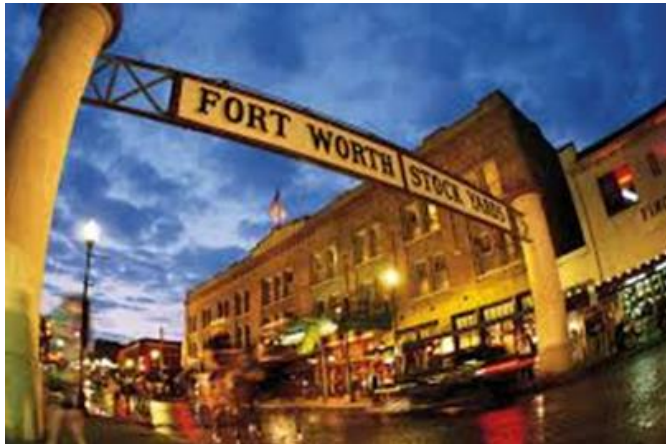
