QUALIFICATIONS

As the Chief of Police for the Decatur Police Department I have duties that include supervision and evaluation of all forty three full time and reserve personnel, coordinate staffing, investigating employee misconduct and take the appropriate actions needed. I assist in revising and updating department policies, and stay current of state laws and department policies. It is my job to prepare, process, and maintain a variety of written reports and records pertaining to assigned activities including daily, weekly, monthly, and yearly activity reports. I review incident reports, required forms, summons, records, and related documents prepared by subordinates to ensure accuracy and timely completion. I oversee the selection and hiring of assigned personnel, train and evaluate assigned personnel, assist with training and orientation of new employees, provide training, guidance, and counseling to assigned personnel, complete employee performance evaluations and reviews as required. I also insure the promotion and career development of subordinates. I prepare reports for the City Manager and prepare and maintain the department's budget (3.29 million). I oversee all aspects of the department including patrol, communications, investigations, school resource officers, and reserve officers. Computer skills that I routinely use in this position include Microsoft Excel, Word, and Power Point.

I currently serve as an assessor for the Texas Police Chiefs Association Law Enforcement Agency Best Practices Recognition Program. The Best Practices were carefully developed by Texas Law Enforcement professionals to assist agencies in the efficient and effective delivery of service, the reduction of risk and the protection of individual's rights. This requires an understanding of all 166 Best Practice Policies. I travel all across Texas from agency to agency as times arises to ensure compliance with the agencies involved in the recognition process.

In 2009 with the backing of Retired Chief of Police, Rex Hoskins, I started the first Citizen's Police Academy. Since that time the department has held sixteen classes in which over 100 citizens from the city and county have completed the training. This has lead to the creation of the Decatur Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association and the Citizens on Patrol.

I have served as President and Vice President for the Texas Citizens on Patrol Association. During this time I was able to work with other citizens programs across the State of Texas with a goal to promote and grow the working relationships between the police departments and its citizens. Due to my work with the association I am distinguished as a Lifetime Member.

During my time at the Decatur Police Department I have started and promoted many of the programs that the department operates today. Programs such as the Explorer Post # 5307 was started in 2005, Citizens Police programs in 2009, Summer Vacation with Decatur PD in 2017, and along with our administrative assistant the Santa Cops Program in 2006. I have served as President of the Departments non-profit Back the Blue

Scholarship Fund that has provided over \$31k dollars to local seniors since 2014. I have written numerous grants in which the department has received over \$500k dollars in grant monies. These grants were used to purchase equipment such as child id kits, vehicles, fingerprint machines, and a texting and driving simulator for the S.T.A.R.S (Stop Texting and Recognize Safety) initiative.

In my 22 year career in law enforcement I have been blessed to have been able to serve and learn from some of the finest men and women in the profession. During this time I have been certified as an EMT-B and also as a Firefighter. These two professions along with the law enforcement career has provided me ample opportunities to continue to learn and give back to my community. I have experience in Incident Command and Hazmat training. I have attended numerous Leadership training courses, and received my Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice Administration. I have served as a Team Leader in the Decatur and Bridgeport Joint SWAT Team. I am currently enrolled in the Certified Public Managers Course through Texas State University. 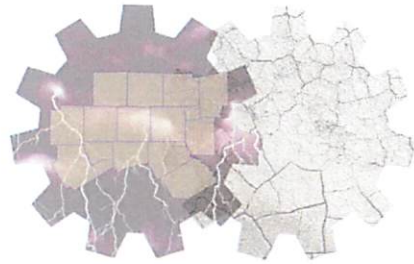
