**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF AGING AND DISABILITY RESOURCE CENTER
CRITICAL RELIEF FUNDS FOR COVID-19 PANDEMIC RESPONSE**

WHEREAS, the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) is a Texas political subdivision and non-profit corporation organized and operating under Texas Local Government Code Chapter 391 as the regional planning commission for the 16-county North Central Texas region; and,

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ALLOCATIONS FOR FAMILIES FIRST AND CARES ACT NUTRITION SERVICES

WHEREAS, the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) is a Texas political subdivision and non-profit corporation organized and operating under Texas Local Government Code Chapter 391 as the regional planning commission for the 16-county North Central Texas region; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG is a voluntary association of, by, and for local governments established to assist in planning for common needs, cooperating for mutual benefit, and coordinating for sound regional development; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG has been designated as the Area Agency on Aging (AAA) for State Planning Region 4A by the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC); and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG is entrusted to allocate federal and state funds distributed through HHSC for nutrition services; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG has completed competitive procurement to form a network of 13 nutrition subrecipients; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG has received approximately \$3.7 million in Families First and CARES Act funding that is dedicated to nutrition services and allocated on a unit rate basis; and

WHEREAS, NCTCOG has received approximately \$1.2 million in CARES Act Funding for other services, and wishes to dedicate approximately \$300,000 to Special Initiatives, and make such funds available to nutrition subrecipients for reimbursement of COVID-19 related expenses that are part of a work plan that's been approved by NCTCOG and HHSC.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

Section 1: The NCTCOG Executive Board authorizes increased allocations to nutrition subrecipients to reflect the addition of Families First and CARES Act funds in the estimated amounts below, which may be adjusted by staff based on actual state and federal allocations:.

Section 1. NCTCOG is authorized to receive Surface Transportation Block Grant Program funds as reflected in Attachment 1.

Section 3. The Executive Board accepts the fiduciary responsibility to administer the planning and implementation programs carried out with these funds.
