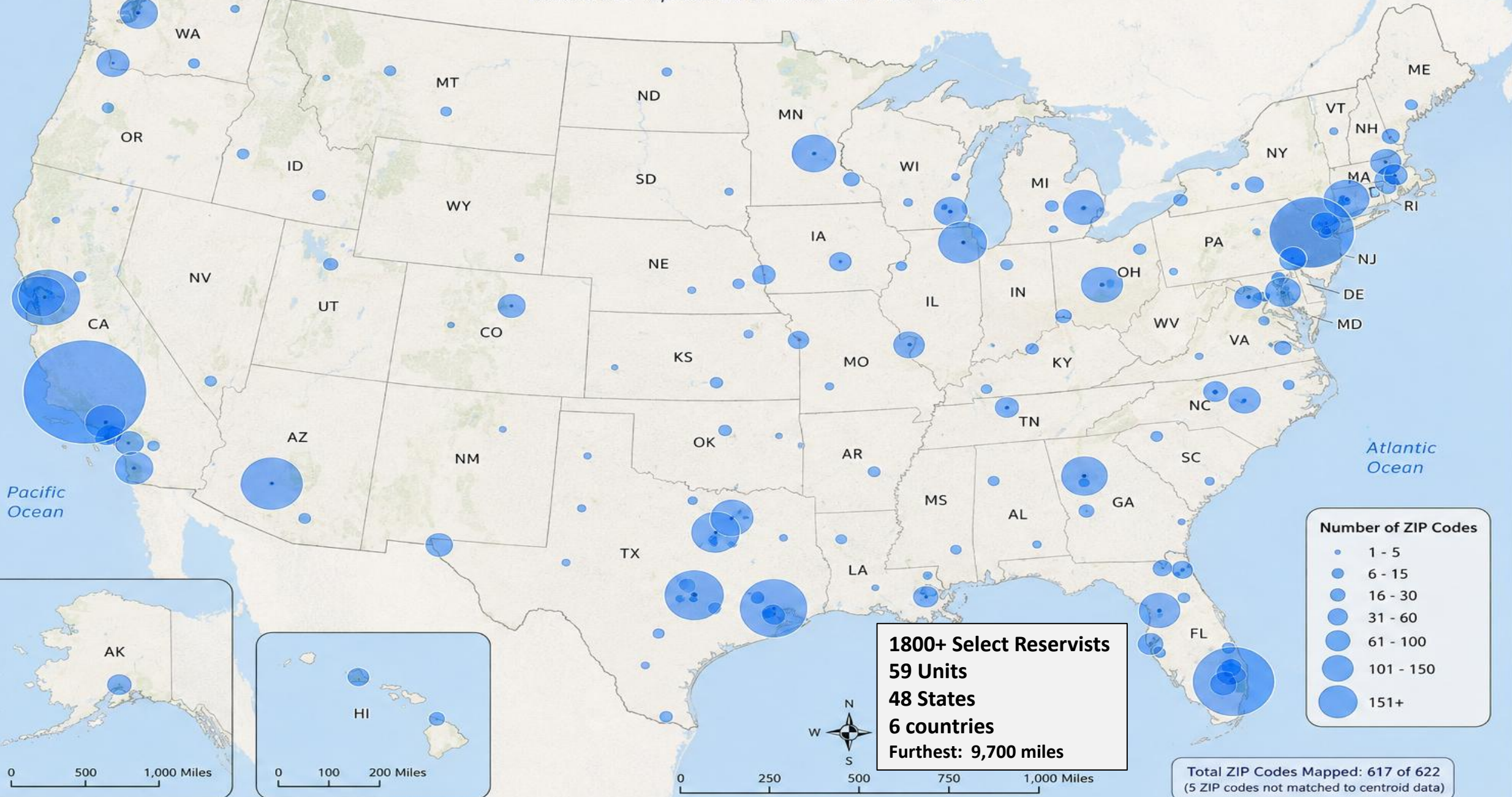

Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration Program



Since 2004, Trust for Public Land (TPL) has partnered with the military and communities to:

- Leverage nearly \$164M in REPI funds
- Completed 109 projects in 15 states
- Conserved over 170,000 acres
- Fair market value of over \$400 million
- Supported annual appropriation increase from \$50M in 2004 to \$200M in 2025



What makes a successful partnership?

- Collaboration and a shared vision among partners
- Commitment to the long-term success
- Communication regularly especially around planning and expectations
- Sense of mutual success – share the stage and win for the community
- Strong leadership

REPI Benefits

- **Reduces** encroachment risk to safeguard critical military training and testing areas.
- **Protects** natural habitats and working lands while ensuring continued military operations.
- **Enhances** water quality and resilience
- **Improves** quality of life for service members and families
- **Strengthens** community

Land Protection Tools

Conservation Easement (CE) or Restricted Use Easement (RUE)

- Protect Land without Ownership
- Land is conserved in perpetuity
- Limit future development
- More affordable than acquisition (50%)
- Voluntary landowners and agencies
- Tax benefits
- 50% cost share

Land Acquisition

- Purchasing Land – change of ownership (public sector)
- Control use and access
- Responsible for maintenance
- Land use is compatible
- Cost share method for public acquisitions
- 50% cost share

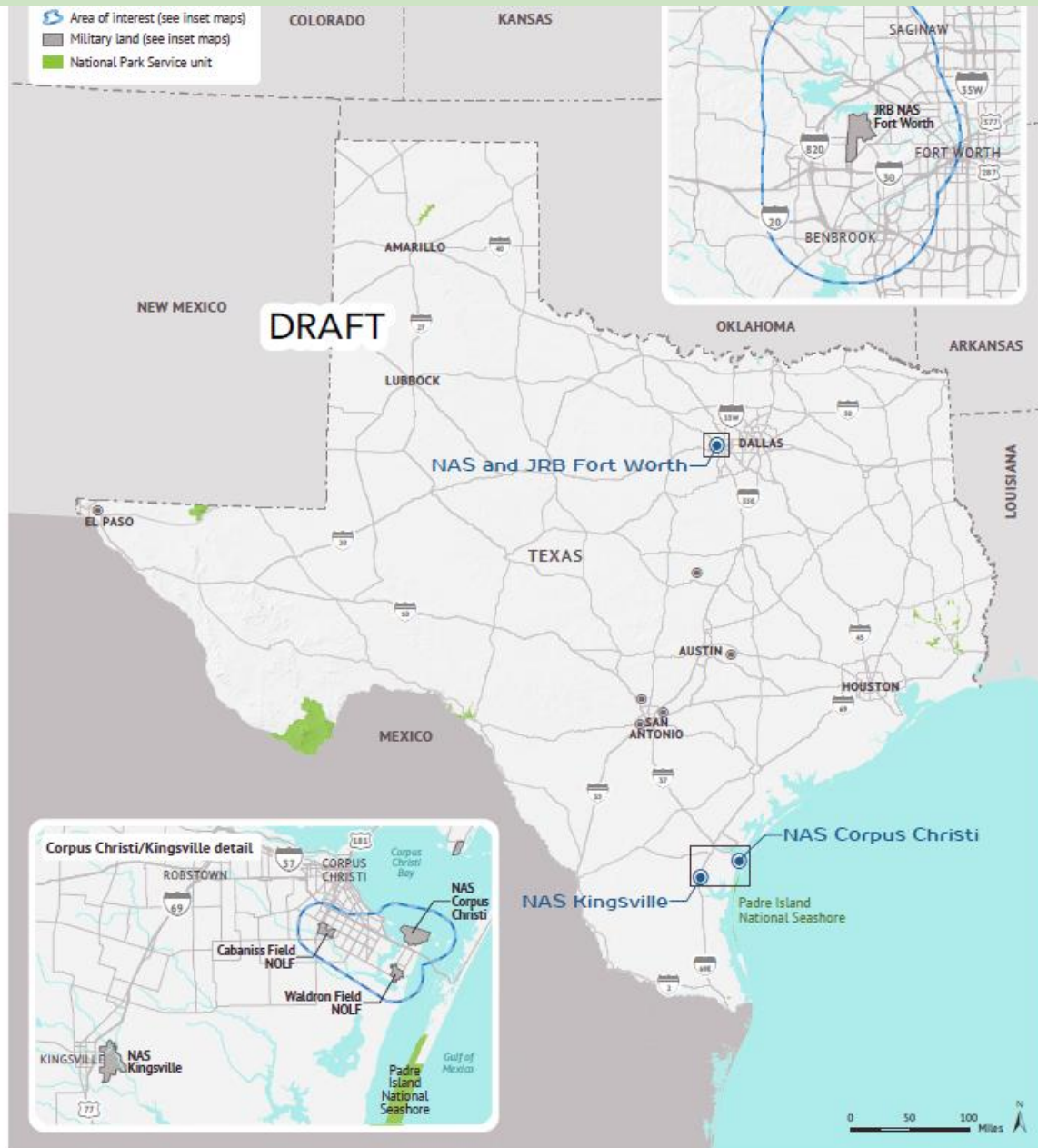

Role & Core Activities

- TPL serves as a strategic partner, facilitator, and implementer—bridging federal, state, and local interests to deliver conservation solutions that align with defense priorities.
- **Partnership Development & Expansion**
 - Establish national agreements with Armed Services to increase TPL's ability to respond to identified needs.
 - Expand partnerships to include community infrastructure, climate planning services, applied research, and military family quality-of-life initiatives.
- **Project Identification & Delivery**
 - Work directly with installations and military services to identify priority lands once partnership agreements are in place.
 - Structure, negotiate, and complete land acquisitions or conservation easements with willing landowners for permanent protection.
 - Develop project financing strategies and secure matching funds.
- **Program Strategy**
 - Inform and garner support from Congress, states, and local governments.
 - Assist the Department of Defense on programmatic strategies, including Sentinel Landscapes, REPI Challenge projects, federal matching authority, and implementation planning.

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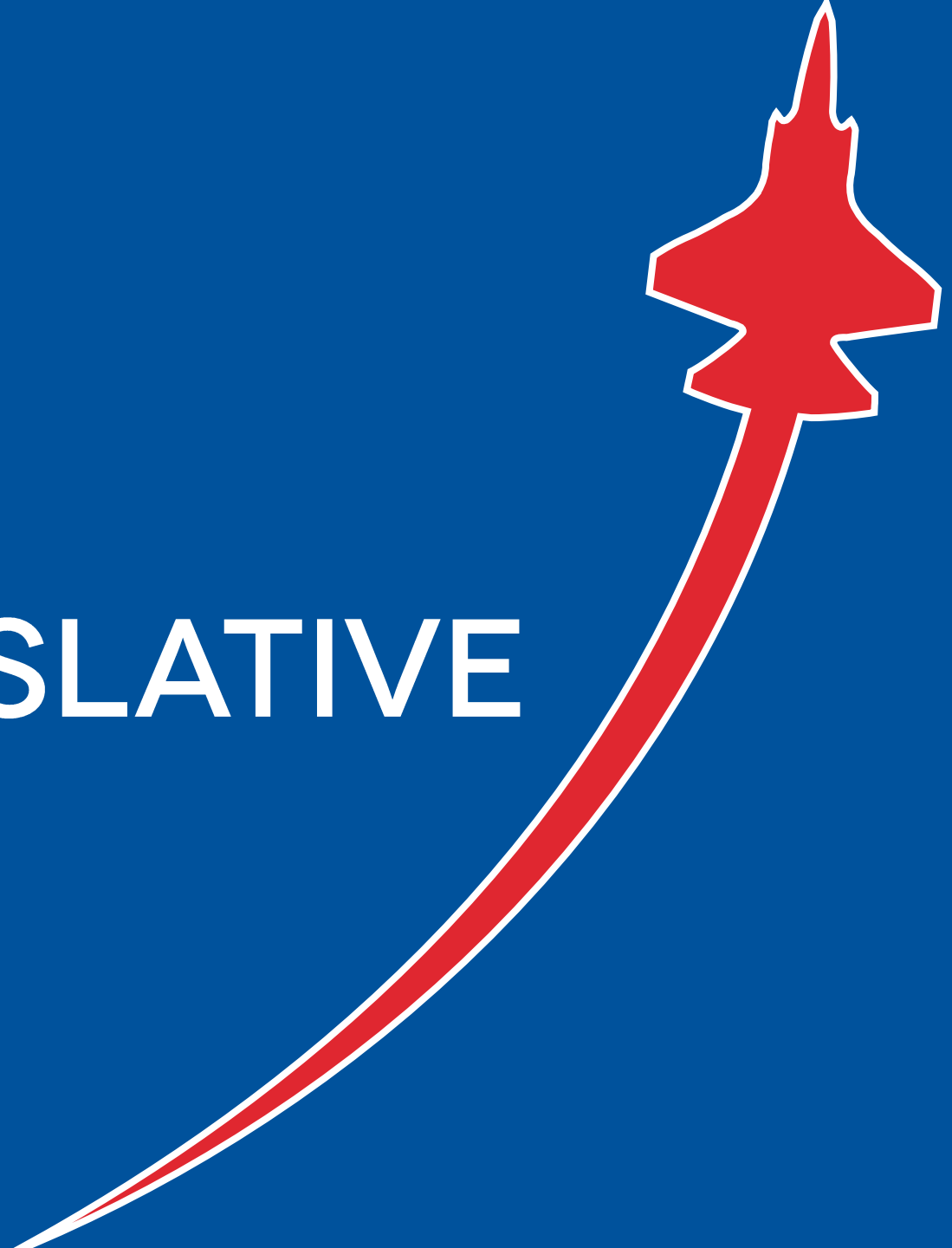

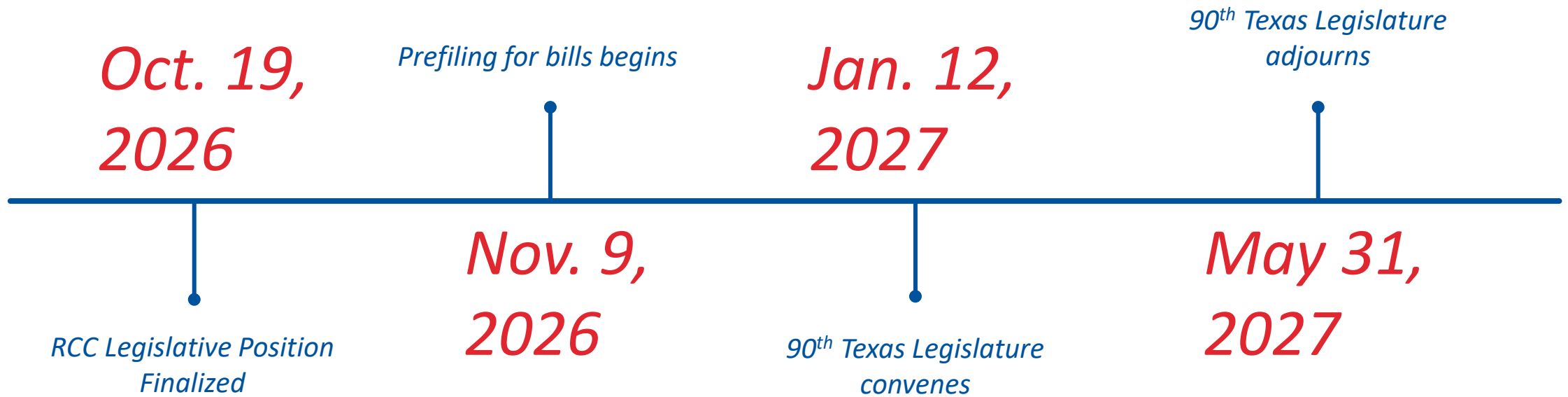

PREAMBLE

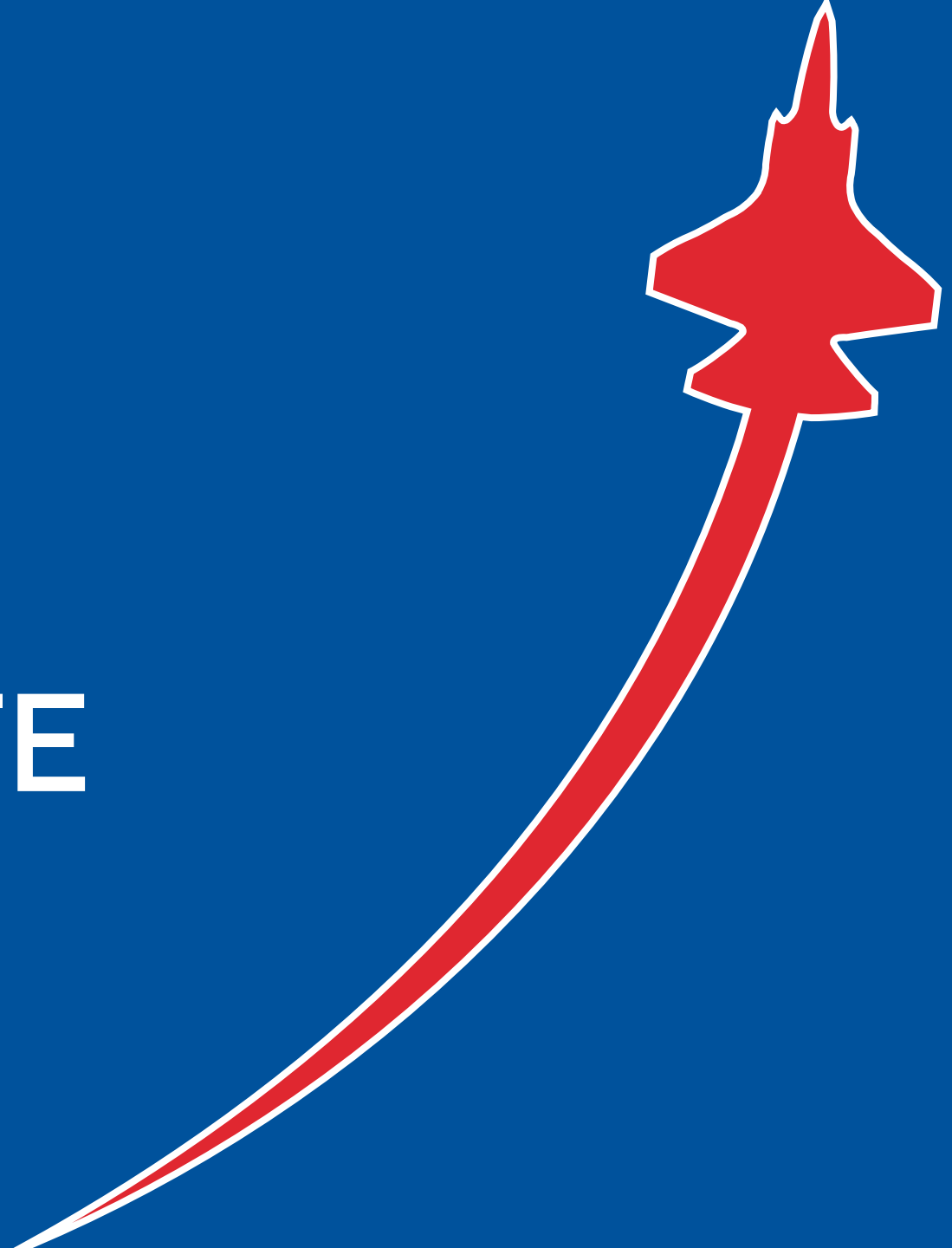
- The NAS JRB Fort Worth Regional Coordination Committee (RCC) is a voluntary organization of local governments formed to promote and preserve the military mission at the installation. The RCC encourages compatible land use planning, conducts community outreach, and participates in military affairs surrounding NAS JRB Fort Worth by providing cities and counties with enhanced options to manage development near military installations and within training areas.
- Therefore, the RCC seeks legislation that promotes the safety and well-being of the communities surrounding NAS JRB Fort Worth through compatible development and quality of life, as well as legislation that minimizes encroachment upon the military installation, potentially compromising its mission. Legislation is sought that will:

LEGISLATIVE GOALS

- Create effective processes to protect the safety of military flight operations prior to approval of proposed development projects that may directly impact military operations, such as wind turbines, communications towers, lighting, foreign government entity investment adjacent to military installations, and sensitive land uses;
- Provide continued and full funding for the Defense Economic Adjustment Assistance Grant program and the Texas Military Value Revolving Loan Fund.

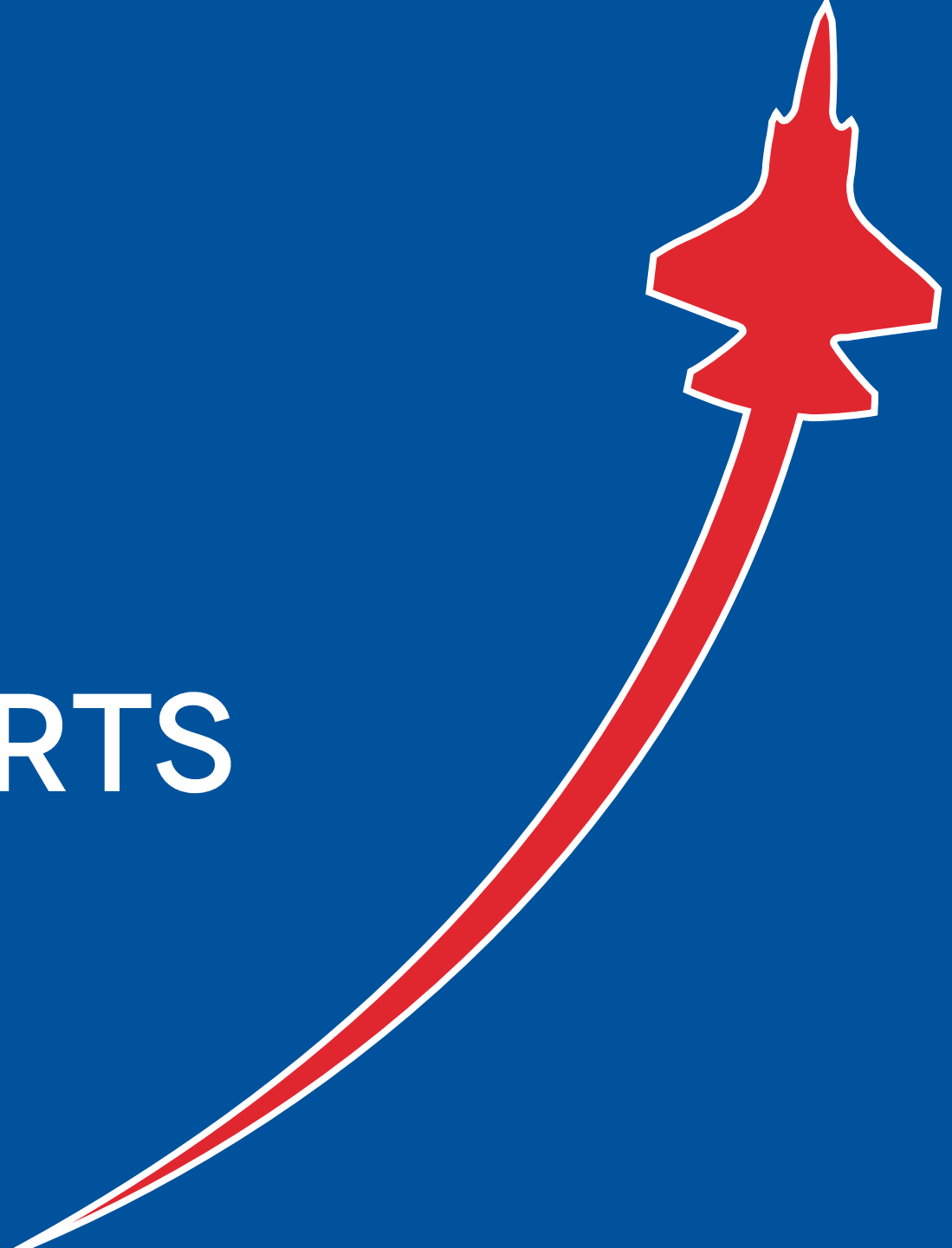

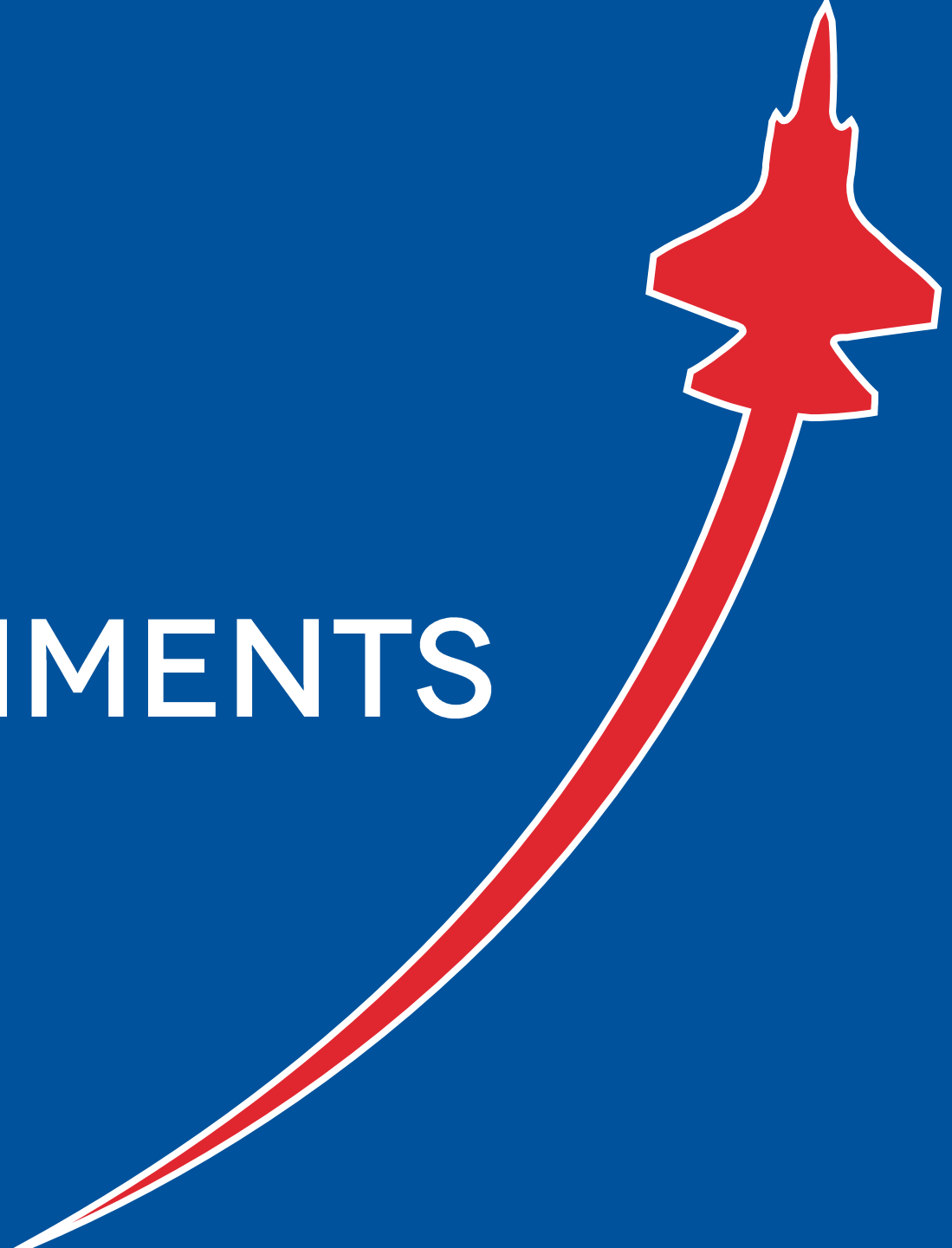
