

CDC Model Files Updated



- ▶ The most recently updated NFIP-CDC Consolidated Model files have been uploaded to the NCTCOG website.

CDC Expansion – TSI Project Area

- ▶ The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers recently presented on opportunities to expand the CDC Program into the TSI project area at the Model Development and Floodplain Ordinances Workshop (January 29, 2026).
- ▶ As part of a task identified in the 2021 TSI project agreement between the TWDB and NCTCOG, a Pilot Study was developed to evaluate and document the process of expanding the CDC Program to a selected community within the TSI project area:
 - ❖ The City of Weatherford was selected due to its high population and availability of H&H modeling to use as a basis.
 - ❖ A subsequent report was generated to provide guidance to communities interested in replicating this process.



3. CDC Expansion – TSI Project Area

❖ Pilot Study Area:

Town Creek Watershed

➤ CDC Models based on 2055 future conditions were created using a 2020 FEMA Flood Risk Identification (FRI) study.

3. CDC Expansion – TSI Project Area

- ▶ At the next FMTF meeting in May, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will further introduce this item and open it for discussion with the Task Force.

3. CDC GIS Interactive Mapping Tool

 - ▶ NCTCOG will assume maintenance responsibilities of the mapper




3. CDC GIS Interactive Mapping Tool


- [Flower Mound Development Projects Mapper](#) – Includes the ability to attach applicable documents.

3. Community Rating System: Multijurisdictional Program for Public Information (PPI)

Insight from others - formation

- 2 multijurisdictional PPIs formed from local CRS Users Groups
 - Capital Regional Area Floodplain Taskforce (CRAFT)
 - Flood Loss Outreach Awareness Taskforce (FLOAT)
- CRS Users Groups meet monthly (virtual)
- Facilitated by University of New Orleans' Center for Hazard Assessment Response and Technology (UNO-CHART)



3. Community Rating System: Multijurisdictional Program for Public Information (PPI)

Insight from others - makeup

- ▶ 8 communities participate in CRAFT PPI
- ▶ 12 communities participate in FLOAT PPI
- ▶ 1-2 CRS Users Groups meetings dedicated to PPI coordination annually (hybrid)
 - ▶ At least 2 for PPI development
 - ▶ At least 1 for annual review
- ▶ Communities responsible for inviting and ensuring their stakeholders attend



3. Community Rating System: Multijurisdictional Program for Public Information (PPI)

Insight from others - responsibilities

► Communities:

- Stakeholder meeting attendance/participation
- Provide information needed for PPI (e.g., repetitive losses, building counts, list of projects, etc.)
- PPI adoption

► Facilitator:

- Coordinate meetings
- Assist with regional stakeholder attendance/participation
- Develop PPI document based on community/stakeholder input

3. Community Rating System: Multijurisdictional Program for Public Information (PPI)

Insight from others – specific questions


- No issues with reaching quorum
- Hybrid option helps with attendance
- Community with individual PPI to participate in FLOAT PPI and let theirs lapse
- Community initially included in CRAFT PPI, did not participate in meetings and was dropped



3. Community Rating System: Multijurisdictional Program for Public Information (PPI)

Next Steps

- ▶ Reconvene North Central Texas CRS Users Group
- ▶ Next meeting to include multijurisdictional PPI discussion
- ▶ Include state ISO/CRS specialist
- ▶ Ideal meeting timeframe and format?



3. Minor Updates

► Update the CDC Manual to the 5th Edition

- Conferred with Fort Worth and USACE– Section 4 is the last portion that requires revision.
- Reformatting will be handled by NCTCOG once Section 4 is complete.

► Update Communities' Acreage in Floodplain (FIRM)

- Met with USACE to determine purview, agreed that simple mapping of updated acreage can be done in-house at NCTCOG.
- Will be reaching out to communities' FPAs within the coming weeks.

► FY 2027 Cost Share Estimates

- FY 2027 Cost Share Estimates were sent out January 26, 2026.
- No change in cost share dues from FY 26.



Development and Floodplain Regulations Model Code Workshop


- ▶ Workshop held January 29th

- ▶ Guest speakers from Texas A&M AgriLife (Fouad Jaber & Yufan Zhang) presented GSI components of the TSI Study, including modeling work and long-term GSI maintenance findings.
- ▶ Reviewed website survey results (2 responses); feedback emphasized improving accessibility (mobile-friendly, smaller files) and making the website more user friendly and searchable.


