TxDOT Dallas District Facts

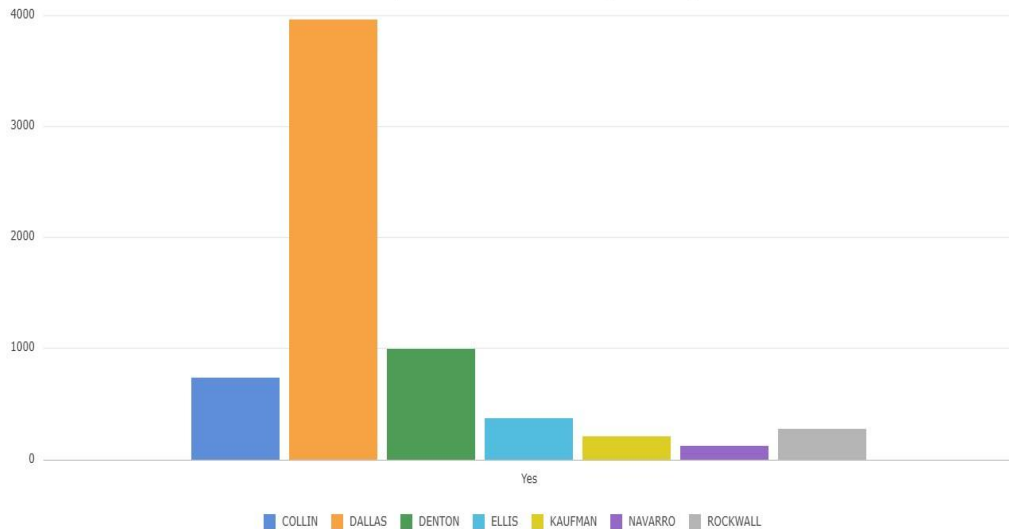
- Seven Counties (Collin, Dallas, Denton, Ellis, Kaufman, Navarro, Rockwall)

2025 CMV Incidents

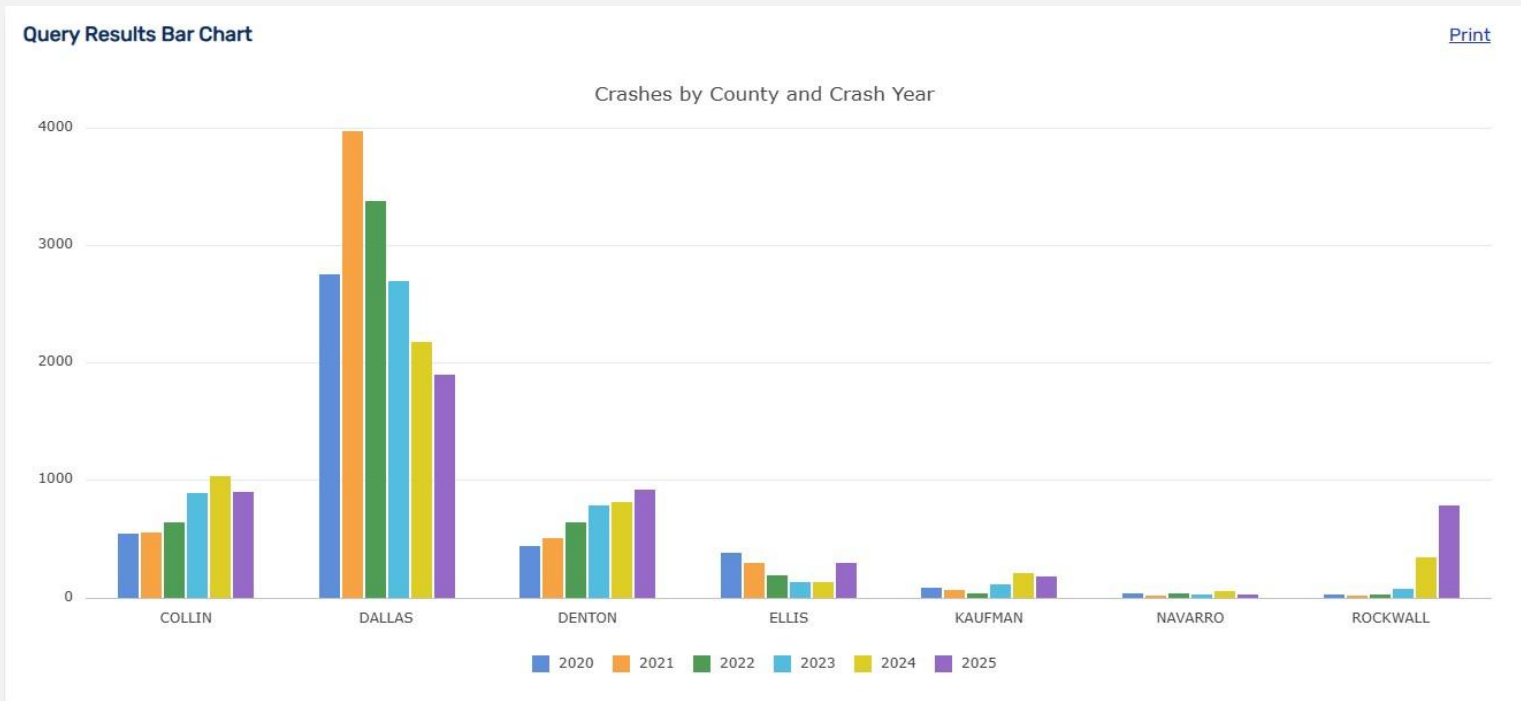
Query Results Bar Chart

TxDOT Response

- Responsible Party (RP)* holds primary responsibility for cleanup. This can be done by a vendor of their choosing.
- TxDOT notified (via DalTrans or on-call personnel) of incident by local authorities.
- If RP is unwilling or unable to initiate a cleanup operation, TxDOT will call in one of our authorized contractors to do the work.
- Contact TxDOT Hazmat Coordinator directly for unusual incidents or any questions/concerns.

TxDOT Dallas Authorized Hazmat Contractors

- Primary: Lone Star Hazmat 888-942-9628
- Secondary: Protect Environmental Services 817-589-9005
- Tertiary: CG Environmental (Enviroserve) 855-457-1777
- The RP or other agencies are free to use companies of their choosing, if TxDOT calls in a contractor it will be one of these three.

TxDOT Hazmat Contractor expectations

- 30 minutes to mobilize from the time we call the incident in.
- On scene and initiating work within 60-90 minutes* of mobilization.
- Primary goal is to safely return the travel lanes to a condition which allows them to be opened for safe travel.
- Secondary goal is returning the ROW and other areas to pre-incident condition.
- Our ultimate goal is returning the entire site to usable condition in a safe and efficient manner.

How You Can Help Us

- Notify TxDOT ASAP if you think that you need assistance for any part of an incident.
- The more details we have on a spill the better our response can be. Materials involved, approximate quantity, has any impacted a storm drain or body of water, on/off the roadway, etc.
- This information and more will let our contractor prioritize what equipment and assets to mobilize first.

How You Can Help – TxDOT Employees

- Take photos of the responsible party vehicle ASAP after you arrive on scene (emphasis on company name, DOT numbers, placards, damage)
- Follow your section protocol on calling for Hazmat clean-up (call hazmat coordinator, supervisor, or contractor directly)
- Get a police report number if available
- Even if a cleanup is done by a non-TxDOT contractor, please notify the hazmat coordinator of the incident and details
