NCTCOG Staff Preliminary Assessment: The proposed action is consistent with Joint Land Use Study (JLUS) recommendations. The property is located in the 65 dB noise contour, and the proposed use is for an auto repair business. U.S. Department of Defense guidelines indicate repair services are generally compatible in the 65 dB noise contour without sound attenuation.

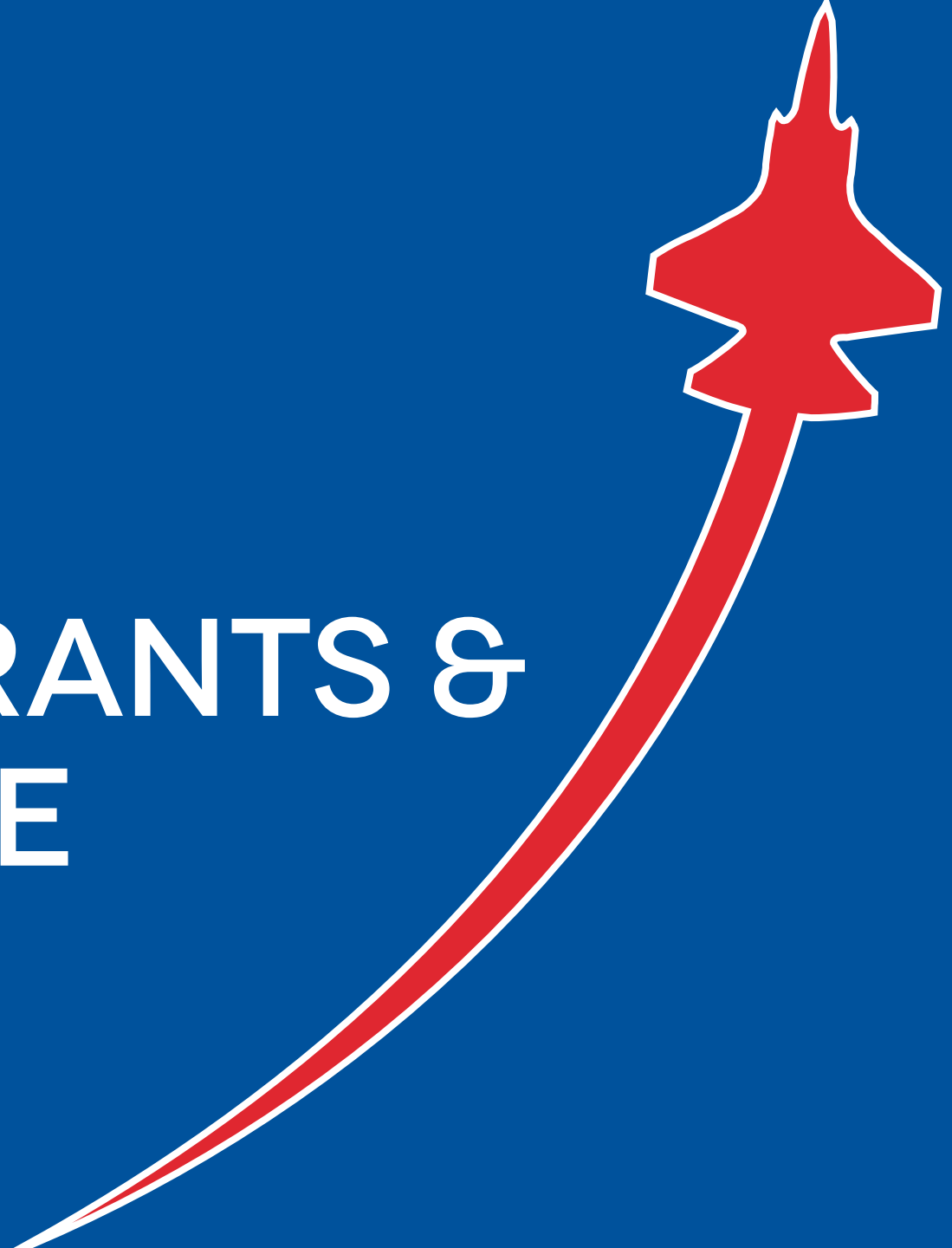

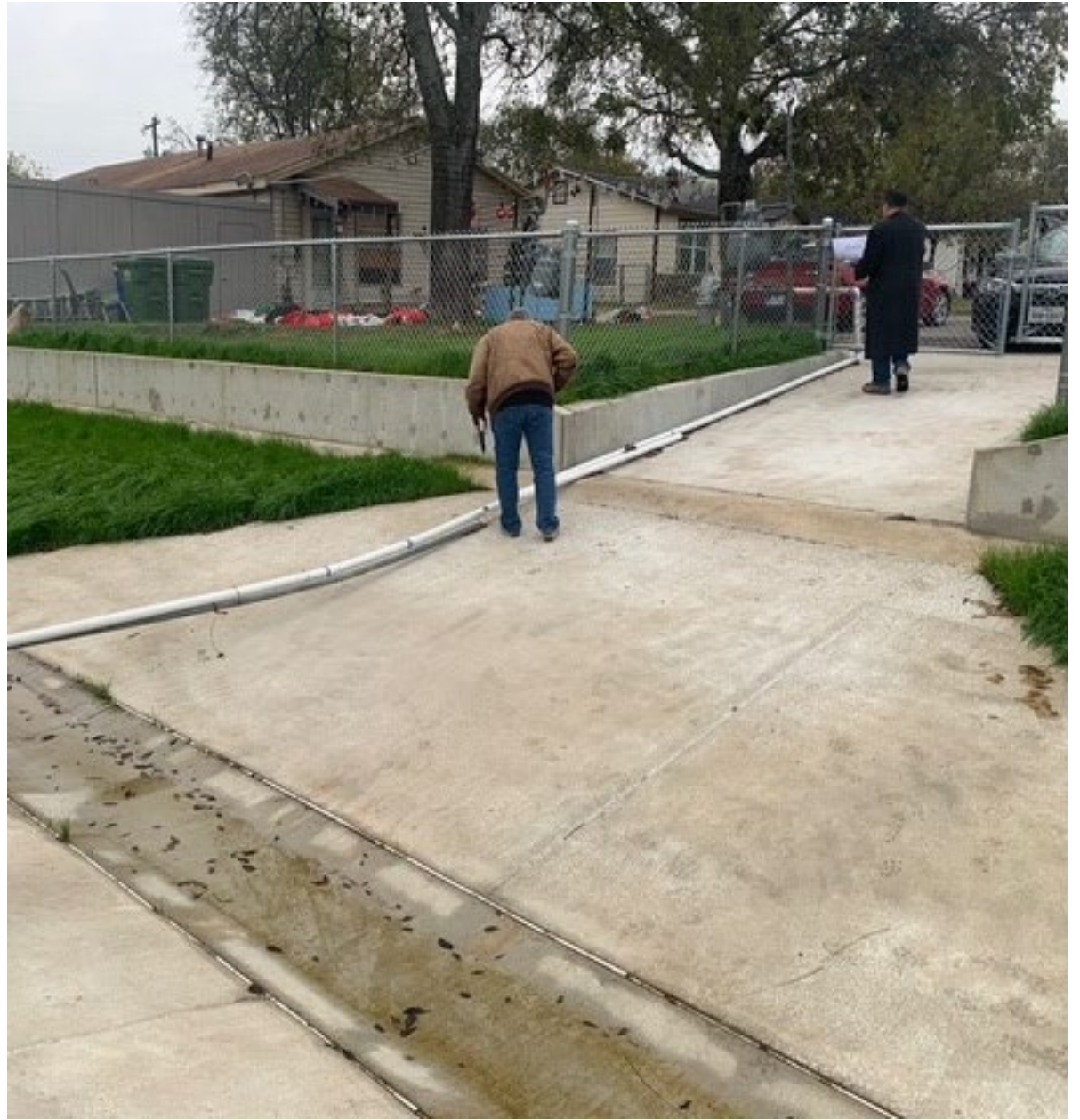

- FY 2026 grant application window expected to open in the spring.

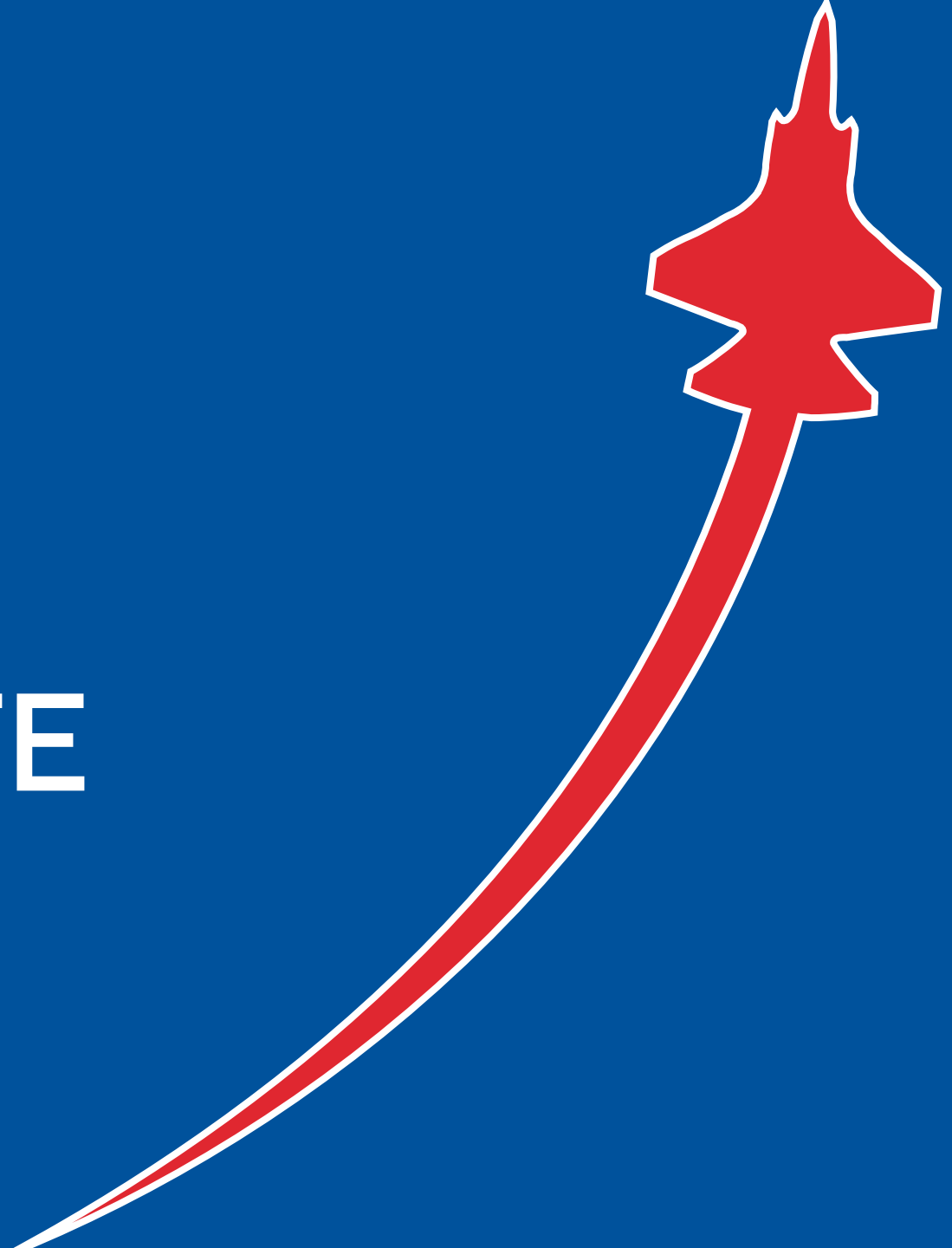

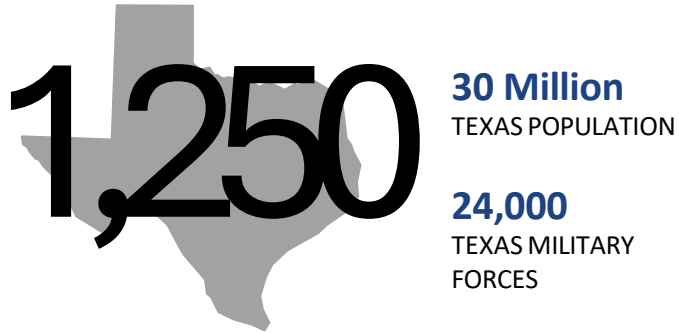

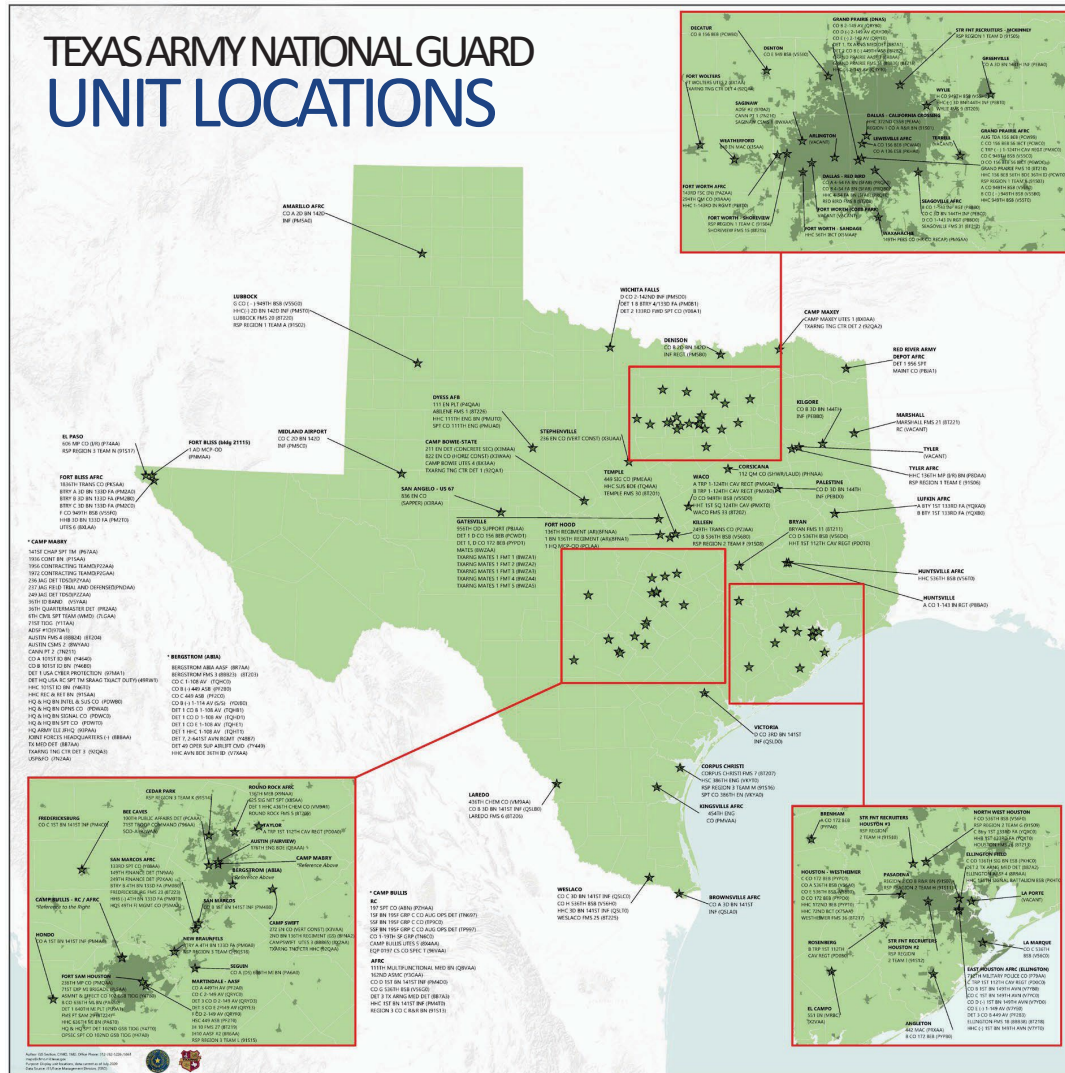

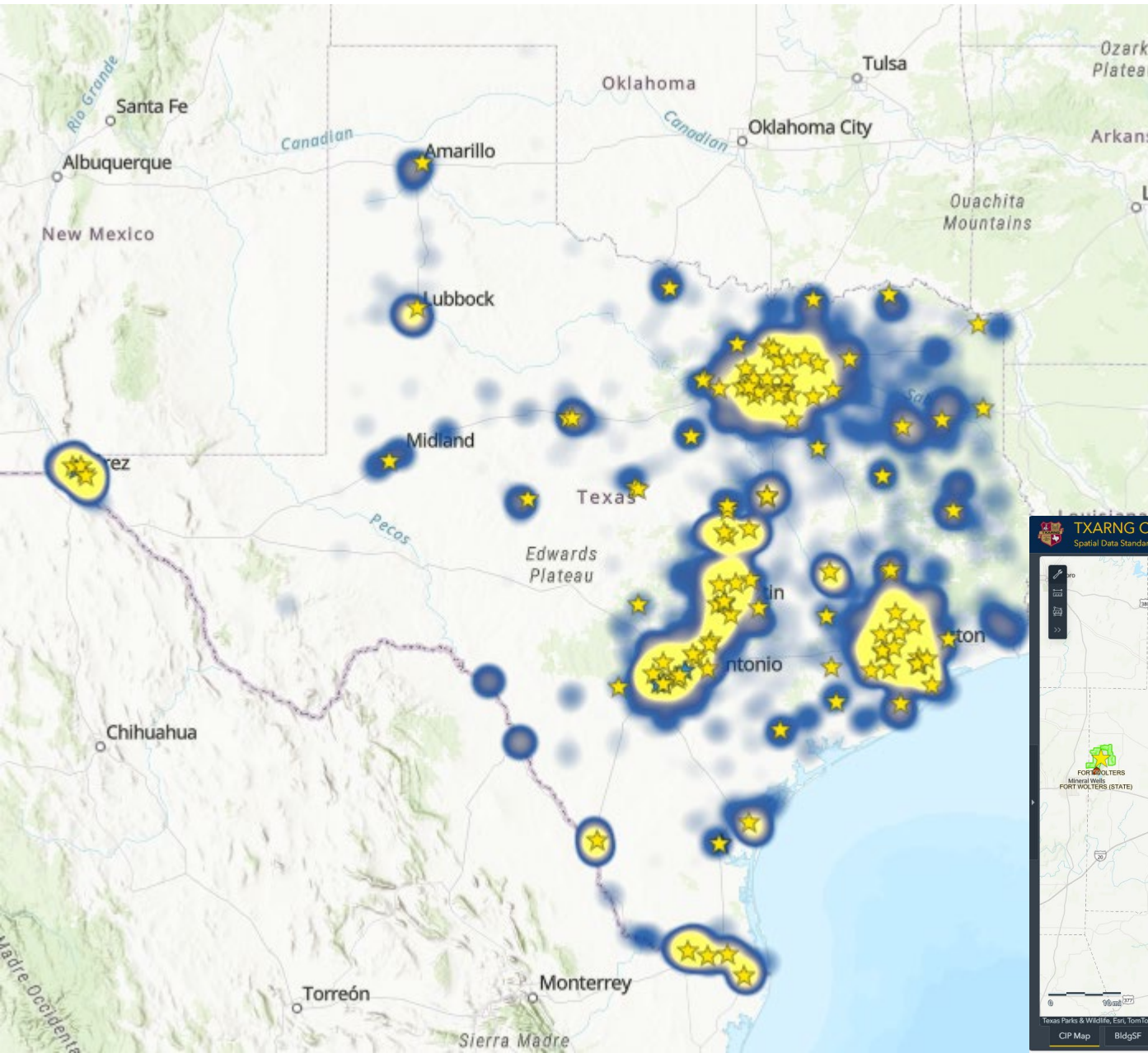

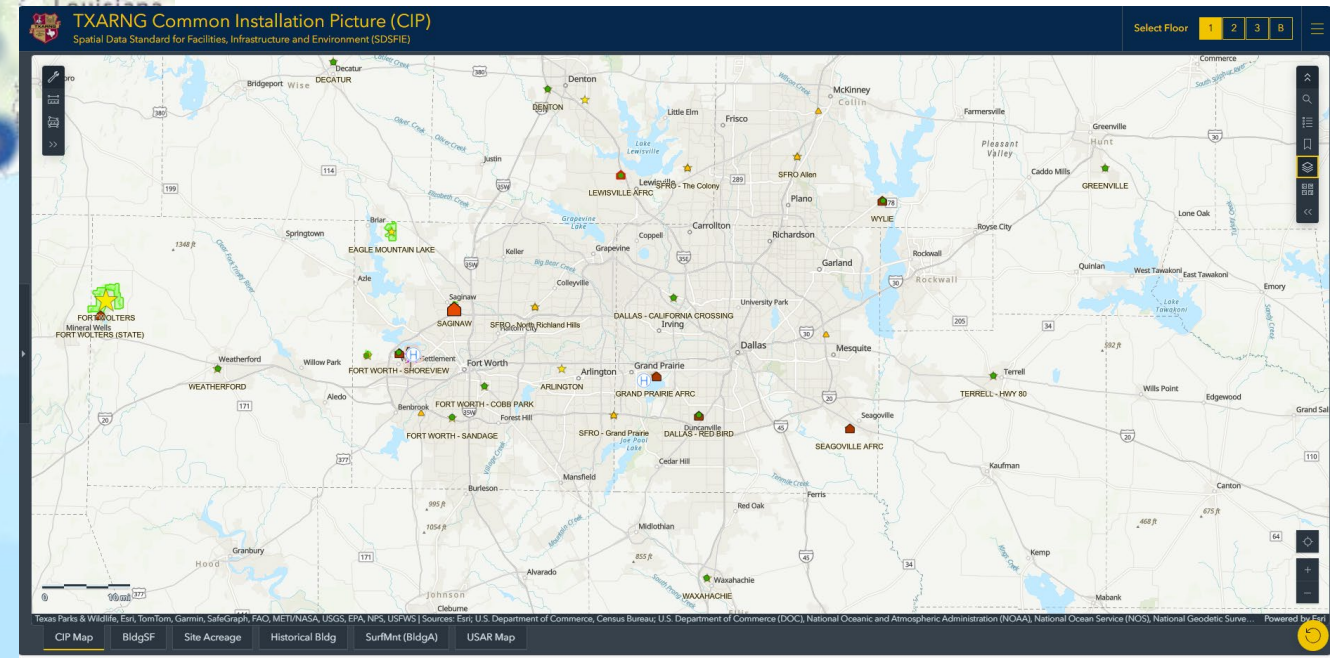

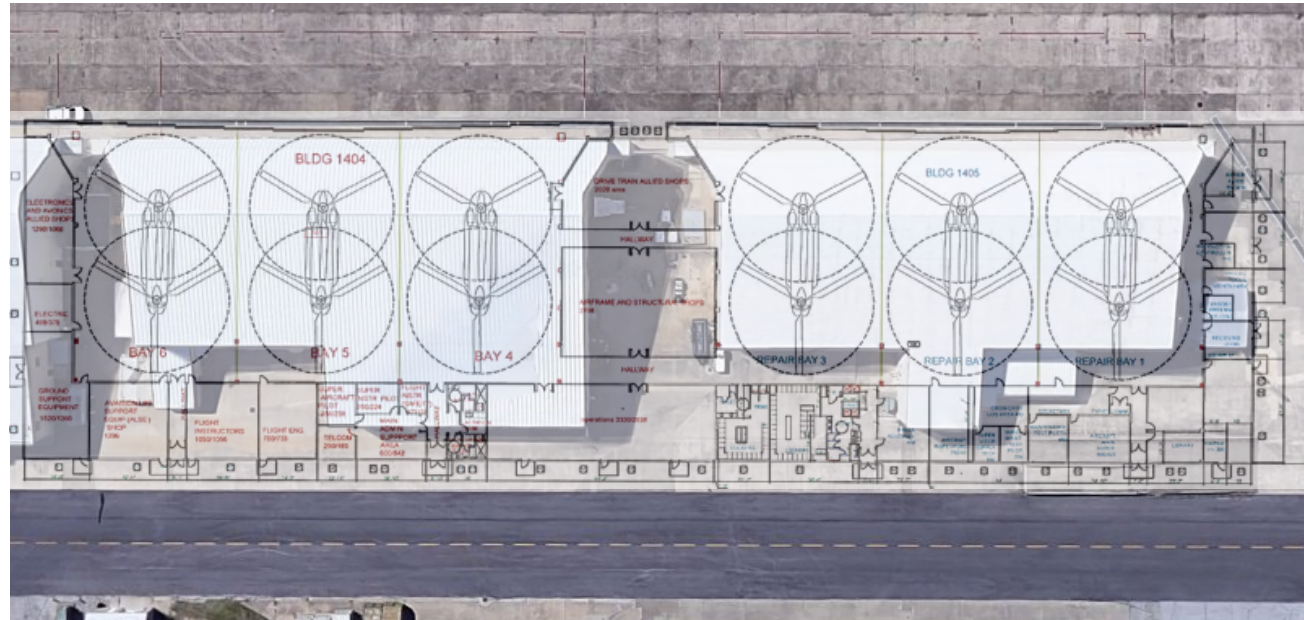

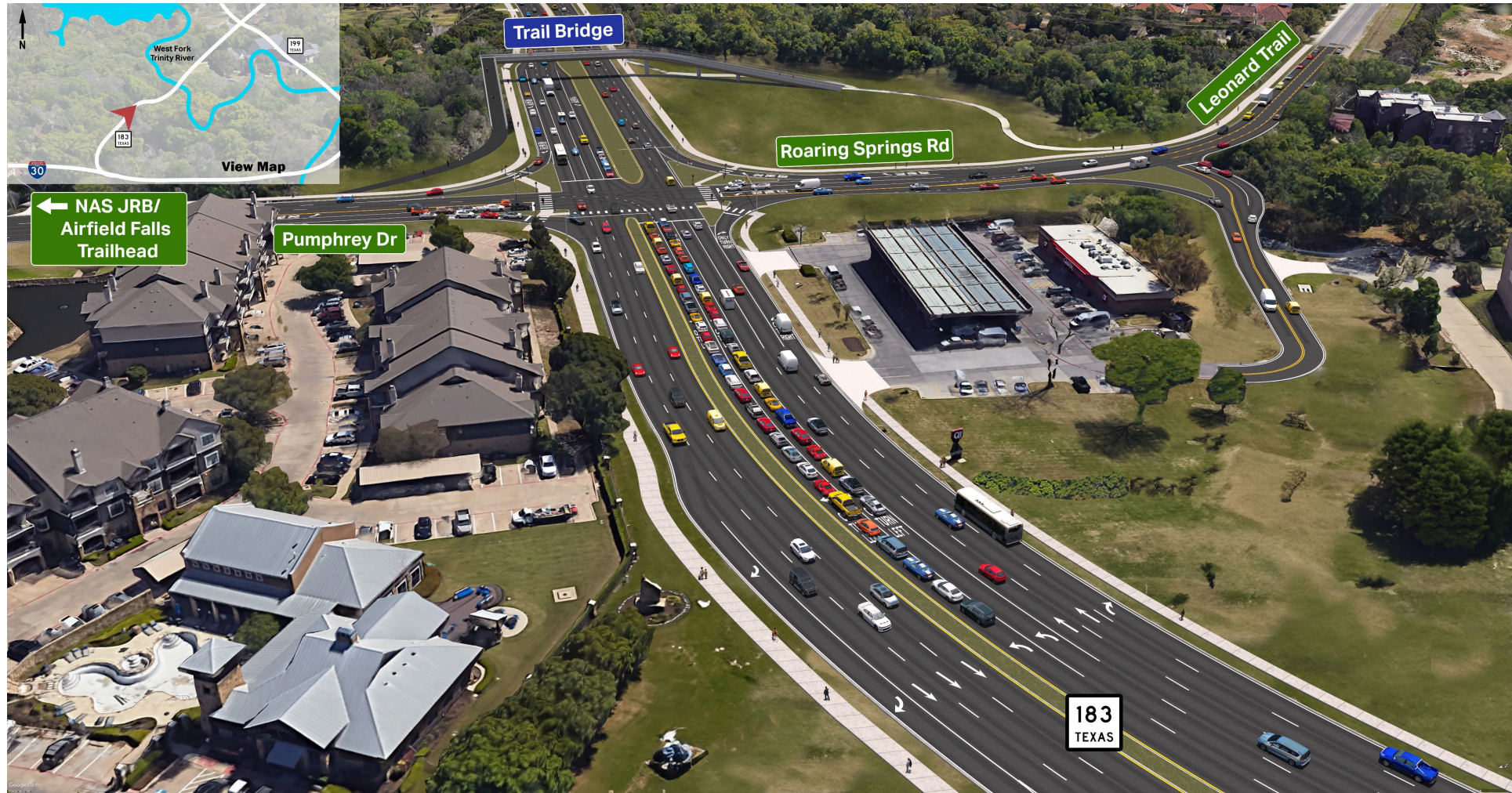
