Summary

Stormwater Pollution Prevention and Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination Task Force Subcommittee of the Regional Stormwater Management Coordinating Council

Tuesday, September 15, 2026

1:30 P.M., Virtual via Microsoft Teams

1. **Welcome and Introductions.**

Keara (NCTCOG) opened the meeting and introduced the task force.

2. **Call for Committee Representative.** NCTCOG staff will solicit a volunteer to present a summary of this task force to the RSWMCC on November 3, 2026.

Trenecia Williams (DFW Airport) volunteered to represent the task force at the Regional Stormwater Management Coordinating Council.

3. **Guest Presentation.** The Task Force will be joined by a guest presenter from TxDOT to discuss the appropriate steps and requirements for reporting a spill to TxDOT.

Justin Springer (TxDOT Dallas), gave a presentation on spill response that could affect TxDOT infrastructure. Justin is an environmental specialist and MS4 program operator. He responds to accidents and spills that occur on TxDOT roads in the Dallas District.

He discussed the response process, including identifying the responsible party, the hierarchy of calls, phone numbers to reach out, response expectations, addressing spills that may have reached a waterway, creating safe and efficient conditions, and what MS4 operators may want to know about seeking assistance from TxDOT and best practices for doing so. Justin is available to meet with staff directly upon request.

NCTCOG staff asked would TxDOT would need to be notified if a spill occurs outside the ROW, but could affect TxDOT ROW. Justin (TxDOT Dallas) responded, yes, please do notify TxDOT.

Andrea McClure (City of Carrollton) ask is it better to take control or to wait for TxDOT. Justin (TxDOT Dallas) responded that it would be better to address spill as soon as possible but do follow up by notifying TxDOT for post-initial cleaning oversight, history, frequency, and legacy pollutant tracing. TxDOT seeks to partner with MS4 operators to ensure good working relationships, process improvement, and assistance. Andrea (City of Carrollton) asked what are the details best shared. Justin (TxDOT Dallas) responded that location, weight, volume, assistance sought, and individual to contact.

FY27 Work Program

4. **Approved FY27 Work Plan.** NCTCOG staff will share an update on the approved FY27 Work Program items for the P2+IDDE Task Force.

NCTCOG staff reviewed a discussion dashboard and rules and guidelines that will be set for the use of and participation of the dashboard. NCTCOG staff shared the approved budget for the Pollution Prevention & Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination Task Force.

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5. **Agenda Planning.** NCTCOG staff will collect information for the FY27 meeting agenda. NCTCOG staff discussed the future agenda for the P2 & IDDE task force in FY27. Staff presented the set dates for the FY27 meetings and requested a vote on the meeting date in January. The majority of meeting attendees preferred January 12. The topics for each of the quarterly meetings were presented.

8. **Roundtable Discussion.**
City of Irving: Jonathon Allen completed a spill response trailer – all of their response needs. Andy recently presented some optical brightener training. Issues with food trucks dumping oil in a pond. Food trucks now get permits from counties, which makes it harder to track. Had a couple of IDDE spill response incidents recently – oil spill. Started industrial inspections, found a glass cutting business was dumping into the sewer system.
Lamar Segar with Plano sought more info on the trailer. Jonathon said he might be able to bring the trailer to the workshop. Irving only dispatches trailer when a responsible party cannot be identified.
City of Plano: Reported minor incidents identified through IDDE and screenings.
City of Mesquite: Reported responding to several major incidents.
City of Fort Worth: Heather Berryman has reported staff turnover and will be responsible for the spills and dry weather screenings. Heather also offered that the City of Fort Worth is open to shadowing when conducting industrial facility inspections.
City of Burleson: Shared several illicit discharge incidents with oil from restaurants and tractor – train incident.
