Already the fourth-largest metropolitan area in the nation, with a population of 8.6 million, Dallas Fort Worth is projected to add another 4 million residents by 2050. To accommodate this growth, the region will need to continue to invest in its multimodal transportation system. In June, the Regional Transportation Council approved Mobility 2050, the region's next long-range transportation plan, which outlines a \$217 billion blueprint for the region's roads, rails, trails and more over the next 25 years. NCTCOG is conducting a campaign through August to highlight the importance of freight safety by encouraging safe mobility practices and interactions between passenger vehicles and large trucks.
