

#### BACKGROUND

- Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the economy has suffered large setbacks and there is an urgency to stimulate the economy.
- As was done in 2009 during the Great Recession, the idea is to inject much needed cash into the local and state economies using infrastructure investment.
- North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) staff recommends funding a fourth round of projects.
- These projects meet one or more of the policies outlined in the current Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) and/or assist in reaching the region's federal performance targets.
- Some of these projects have been the subject of discussions between NCTCOG staff and regional partners over the past several years. This program seeks to bring them to a conclusion. Other projects were submitted by local governments for consideration.

### PROJECT TYPES

- Projects were divided into project types and evaluated against each other:
  - Roadways
  - Complete Streets/Context-Sensitive Design
  - Bicycle/Pedestrian
  - Intersection Improvements
  - Strategic Partnerships (e.g., planning studies, engineering, additional funding on existing projects, nontraditional project types)

## **EVALUATION PROCESS**

- Eligibility criteria considered:
  - For Roadway/Intersection projects, facility must be at least a Major Collector on the Federal Functional Classification System or can justifiably be added
  - For projects with added capacity, additional lanes must be warranted.
- Selection criteria considered include:
  - Traffic volumes/Level of Service (how well traffic moves along a roadway)
  - Air quality benefits (reduction of vehicle emissions)/Cost effectiveness
  - Consistency with the MTP
  - Project addresses a safety issue (history of vehicle crashes)
  - Project addresses federal performance measures (e.g., bridge condition, pavement condition, part of the roadway freight network)
- The criteria/process used for each project type is included with the project listings posted online.

## RECENT STIMULUS FUNDING

- As part of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) was signed into law in December 2020, \$9.8 billion of additional funding was set aside for transportation infrastructure.
- Of that amount, \$803 million is allocated to the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) and \$164 million is allocated to Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) in Texas.
- Approximately \$54 million is allocated to the Dallas-Fort Worth region.
- These funds will be added to the region's existing balance of Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) funds in Fiscal Years 2022/2023.
- This program proposes to incorporate these funds into existing project selection efforts (COVID Round 4+ and the 10-Year Plan).
