

Mansfield ISD Earns Third Consecutive ENERGY STAR Partner of the Year Award

For the third consecutive year, Mansfield ISD has won the ENERGY STAR Partner of the Year Award, which quantife the distort for the ENERGY STAR Sustained Excellence Award. MISD is the enly school district in Toxos this year to carn that distinction.

The Partner of the Year Award is the highest level of Procepturion by the U.S. Environmental Proceetion Agency (EPA). The award is given to expanizations that perform at a superior level of energy management and prove organization-wide energy savings.

Since the start of the MISID energy management originar in 2012, the district has saved more than \$5.2 million in water, electricity, and natural gas costs. The district's curbon disorde emissions have seen reduced by nearly 20,000 metric tons.

The program also educates students and families about the importance of turning off lights, closing doors, and turning off water to promote conservation and metal-rightity.
