“Our job is **lethality** and **readiness** and **warfighting**.”

- Revive the warrior ethos and restore trust in our military
- Rebuild our military by matching threats to capabilities
- Reestablish deterrence by defending our homeland



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Responses/Anticipation

- Align with Executive Orders and Secretary's priorities in your actions and program line actions
- Initiatives in AI siting, domestic mining, and land swaps
 - Public-private partnership opportunities
- Counter UAS - adverse UAS swarming/encroachment that may require communities to work with installations to further address vulnerabilities
- Need to demonstrate outcomes, achievements, deliverables that align with Administration's priorities



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Installation Readiness

- **Needs-Based** – Assist states and communities to work with military installations to plan, enhance infrastructure, and implement measures that contribute to maintaining or improving a military installation's **lethality and readiness**
- National Security Council highlights importance of resiliency and critical infrastructure to installations and communities - Cannot afford infrastructure vulnerabilities that could distract from the mission
 - Executive Order - Achieving Efficiency Through State and Local Preparedness
 - Department of Defense Memorandum – Mission Focus of the Department of Defense
 - “Assessing weather-related impacts on operations, mitigating weather-related risks, conducting environmental assessments, as appropriate, and improving the resilience of military installations”
- Responsive to continuum of needs from cyber attacks, critical infrastructure, Counter-UAS
 - Lessen dependencies and ensure the readiness and sustainability of the installation
- Work with the right people




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Community Noise Mitigation Program

- **Competitive** - Installation of insulation to lessen impacts from noise – can help to lessen deviations to military training routes, ensuring the readiness and lethality of our warfighter and installations.
 - First set of awards will not account for full appropriation
 - Second competition expected to commence in April
 - Funding must be obligated before end of September

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Recent Efforts

Eielson Air Force Base / University of Alaska Fairbanks: Enables the University of Alaska Fairbanks to work with Eielson Air Force Base, Fort Wainwright, the State of Alaska, and local utility companies on permitting for a natural gas pipeline, respond to other energy requirements, and address housing affordability issues.

Naval Air Station Kingsville –Project design for single access road to a ROTH-RX location to obtain funding to carry out improvements. Enhances the readiness of the McMullen Range and border capabilities.

Naval Air Station Oceana - Plan and design ~1.5 miles of a new 30-inch diameter water transmission main to support potable water and water suppression needs at Naval Air Station Oceana and Joint Expeditionary Base Little Creek-Fort Story, ensuring the installations' readiness and lethality.

Naval Air Station, Joint Base New Orleans - Belle Chasse Academy, Inc., a charter to design, renovation, and expansion of current facilities in response to SECDEF priorities by supporting the readiness of our warfighter and their families. This project provides expanded capacity for 30-year student use and supports learning for the more than 650 military-connected students (90% of the enrollment), military families and warfighters, enhancing lethality and readiness by improving recruitment and retention.

Sentinel Program – Extending assistance to communities hosting Sentinel locations.
