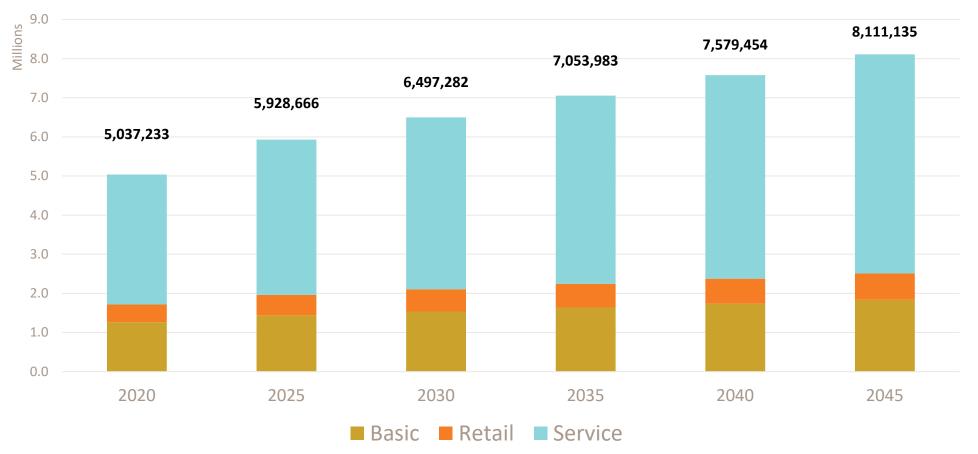

- Local funds (i.e. Sales tax, bond programs, Impact Fees)

Adjusted Baseline

- New state and federal funds recent Bipartisan Infrastructure Law
- Public-private partnerships & future local funds for transit

Revenue Enhancements

- Reasonably anticipated future revenue: equivalent of increases in gas tax and vehicle registration fees
- Future local transportation fees

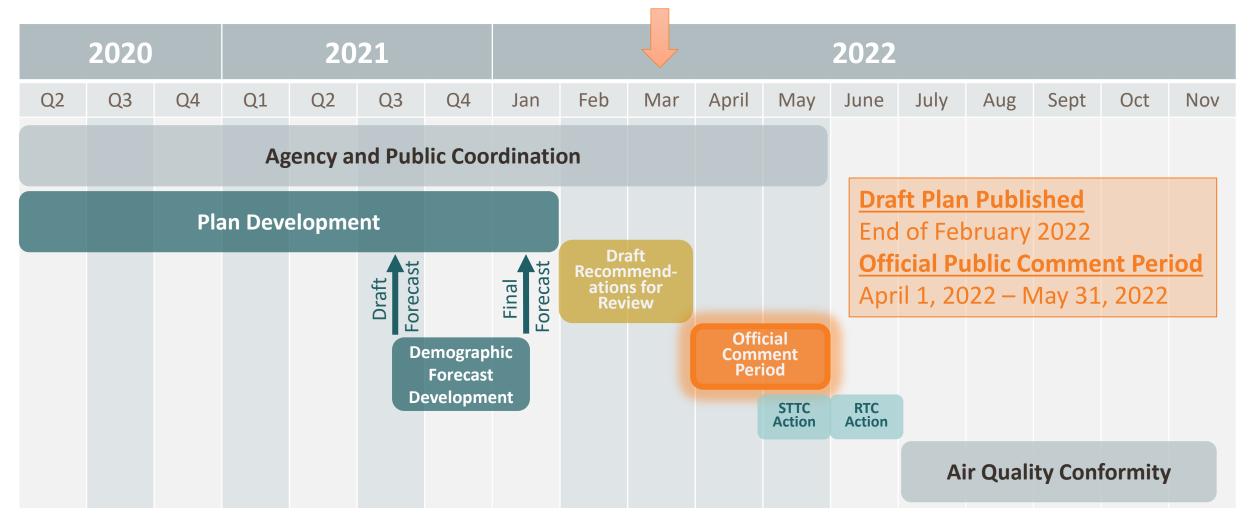
