Approve Summary from Jan. 19, 2021 Meeting

- The Subcommittee agreed that early coordination and clear communication helped complete a successful project.
- There was conflict over high pressure systems that need to be flown over by franchise utilities and cities that plant foliage over them without knowing they were there.
- There was also concern over limited recommendations on street rehab projects.
- Franchise utility reps also wanted to make it clear what laws and regulations they are under so cities know their limitations.
