All proposals will be scored according to selection criteria, with considerations made to proposed contributions and leveraging opportunities.

Question #5: If incentives are part of the program, will the money for those incentives come out of the \$4 million budget?

Response: If proposers include incentives, yes, those incentives will be paid as part of the program budget if recommended by the Selection Committee and eligible under NCTCOG funding sources.
