- ▶ Advocate for increased recreational access and improved water quality along the river




# Trinity River Paddling Trail

- ▶ 130 river miles of paddling trail along the Upper Trinity River
  - ▶ Spans nine cities and three counties
  - ▶ 21 official launch sites for boats, canoes, and kayaks
- ▶ Historical, cultural, and recreational significance to the region
- ▶ Integrated into a single paddling trail by the Trinity Coalition, the nine bordering cities, and Dallas County in 2018

# National Water Trail Designation

- ▶ In 2018, the [Trinity Coalition](#) began working with NCTCOG and communities along the Trinity River and its branches to achieve National Recreation Trail designation from the National Park Service (NPS).
  - ▶ 27 letters of support sent in from all the communities along the trail and several state and regional agencies
- ▶ In October 2020, the Secretary of the Interior [announced](#) 30 new national recreation trails, including the Trinity River National Recreation Trail
  - ▶ Listed as a National Water Trail, a subset of the NPS-designated National Recreation Trails established to protect and restore America's waterways

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# HOW DID THIS PROJECT GET STARTED?

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Over the last year, the City of Denton Parks & Rec dept. has been assessing its trail system to find ways to connect any point of the city to and from Lewisville Lake.

Paddling Trails were identified as a need, as there are currently 0 miles of official trails in Denton.



Fall of 2020, Denton Parks & Rec, had the idea of establishing a 100-mile paddling challenge around Lewisville Lake.

Denton staff led the way in contacting lakefront communities with an interest of collaborating to this mission and creating paddling trails for their community.



Staff was able to gain support from various municipalities, non-profit organizations, and state/federal organizations.

Staff started having established group meetings in January 2021.



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

- Collaborate with other project teams to provide necessary information.


## Programming-Marketing Team


Guidelines for Assessing, Designing, and Building  
Launch Sites for Carry-in Watercraft






**NOTES:**

1. Upstream slide has 73 steps  
Downstream slide has 97 steps
2. Slide subgrade to be at graded to 3:1
3. Tread = 12' & Riser = 6'
4. Step width to be 12'
5. Roll height to be 18"-42"
6. 3/4", #5 Reinforcement bars, 24' long will be placed every 36' on wood ties, and at all corners.
7. Timber to be 6"x8' & CCA presure treated
8. All retaining walls will have maximum height of 2.5'
9. 8' long deadmen will be place in retaining wall every 12' vertically and 8' horizontally



## Trinity River Paddling Trail



The Trinity River Paddling Trail consists of 130 miles of river accessed by 21 official launch sites. The paddling trail traverses 9 municipalities including Dallas and Ft. Worth, and is located in the middle of America’s 4th largest metro area with a population of 7.5 million people. Over 5 million people live within 30 minute drive of the trail.



# Paddling Trail Status August 2021

- All 21 launch sites are open. Area outfitters are providing access for those without boats.
  - One launch is getting difficult to use.
- All but 2 sections are 4-6 mile in length
  - One 12 mile section
  - One 24 mile section
- Plans are in the works for two new launch sites
  - This will breakup the 24 mile section
- Four launch sites need repair or replacement
  - Need a 3 to 5 year plan
- 18 Wayfinding signs are in place
  - Only 3 more to go

**Hazard: Carrollton Dam 300 yards downstream – do not approach the dam.** Portage is on river left starting at the boat ramp. DART Trestle at Bellline is known for log jams.



# Paddling Trail Status August 2021


## ▶ Trinity River National Water Trail

- ▶ The trail has been mostly closed this spring due to high water.
- ▶ Total of 11 weeks - early May to middle of July.
- ▶ 10 area lakes drain down via the main branch of the Trinity River.
- ▶ Typically it takes a few weeks to reopen everything.
  - ▶ Volunteer program is needed to help cleanup the launch sites.




Launch Description: Long gentle slope to a concrete boat ramp.





  - Distance of 15 miles with a portage around Carrollton Dam.

# Paddling Trail Status August 2021

- TxN notified us of TPWD grant opportunity.
- TWPD Habitat and Angler Access Program
- Provides funding up to \$50,000.
- Trinity Coalition sent in two applications.
  - City of Arlington for an Engineering study for new launch in the River Legacy Park. Replacing the current launch.
  - City of Dallas for the replacement of the damaged McInnish Park boat ramp.
  - Two locations of the sites needing a 3-5 year improvement plan.
  - If awarded will have two improved launches that meet ADA.



# Paddle Trail / Future Goals

- Add 3 or 4 new launch sites on the main trail
- Add 2 or 3 new launch sites on the West Fork.
- Create a multi-year improve program with each city.
- Create a volunteer beautification program with each city.
- Extend the trail to Lake Ray Roberts through Lake Lewisville and the Greenbelt Park
- Identify area creeks and tributaries launch points and safety data for each
