In partnership with the Public Works Council (PWC), the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) has developed a Work Program that guides NCTCOG support activities. The Work Program reflects the administrative and financial support needed for the activities associated with the PWC's expanded mission, and details the activities for the 2025 fiscal year that begins October 1, 2024.

- Promoting the updated Public Works Construction Standards drawings
- Ongoing review and development of integrated Stormwater Management Program (iSWM) manuals
- Developing iSWM trainings, resources, workshops, and presentations
- Hosting the Public Works Roundup on September 4, 2025
- Ongoing coordination of cooperative purchasing agreements
- Ongoing promotion of the public works profession
