

How It Works

- Visit www.nctcog.org/mapyourexperience and follow the prompts
- Drop a pin on the map where you have trouble traveling
- Add details in the form
- Identifying information is optional and doesn't appear in dashboard or comment reports
- Zip code helps us perform additional analysis and plan on a regional scale

Summary of comments received



- Bike/ ped make up over half the comments
- Sidewalk or trail availability and bike/ ped safety comprise 38% of all comments
- Roadway over a third of all comments

KEY INSIGHTS



1

Accessibility issues of impedance, or barriers to traveling, are of greater concern for the bicycle/pedestrian mode than transit or roadway.

2

Key bicycle and pedestrian needs are:
wider sidewalks | completion of sidewalks
protected bike lanes | safer speeds on non-arterial roads | crosswalks across arterials

3

Key transit needs are:
1) increased frequency and coverage in existing transit service areas
2) expansion of service to new areas

4

For roadways, traffic and safety are the top comments, frequently showing up in areas with poor level of service.



In many cases, roadway comments are not concerned with speeds, but rather with the safety of merging onto a road, poor visibility, or blind spots.




Roadway



Bike/Ped








