

### 2024 TRANSIT FUNDING UPDATES



### FY2024 AND BEYOND

- FY2023 apportionment made available using 2010 census data
- FY2024 apportionment will utilize 2020 census data
  - In late February, FTA will announce \$11.3 billion in partial-year formula funding, which provides FY2024 funding through March 1, 2024
  - Amounts only will reflect formula funding for five months (Oct 1, 2023 March 1, 2024) based on FY2023 program levels while the government operates under a Continuing Resolution
  - Remaining funds will be apportioned after a full-year appropriation is enacted and FTA publishes full-year tables
  - Staff working to incorporate 2020 census data into allocation methodology
  - Allocation methodology not anticipated to deviate from federal formula

### KEYS TO FORMULA FUNDS

#### Focus on <u>National Transit Database</u> reporting

- More service provided and reported in the urbanized area = More <u>urban funds</u> for the region
- Plan ahead on how formula funds will be used for urban services
  - Ensure financial resources are proportionate to the federal funding requested
  - Ensure a local match is in place for the federal funding requested
- NCTCOG requirements to continue receiving formula funds
  - Work with your Project Managers to develop your Program of Projects
  - Submission of annual audits
  - Adequate financial controls carried out by qualified personnel with checks and balances in place
- Federal Transit Administration (FTA) requirements must be met to continue receiving formula funds
  - FTA's <u>Certifications and Assurances</u>
  - Direct recipients can reach out to their FTA contact for further information



### PROGRAM OF PROJECTS (POP) DEVELOPMENT

- What is POP Development?
  - Process by which NCTCOG works with traditional transit providers to determine funding needs based on current funding levels and expenditures
  - Traditional Transit Providers agencies providing public transportation services and recognized by the state as rural or urban transit providers
  - NCTCOG staff review funding requests and work with providers to accommodate those requests within the confines of the current year apportionment in accordance with applicable regulations
- Per NCTCOG's Regional Transportation Council policy, small provider needs will continue to be met first, with the transit authorities receiving the remainder of the funds
- Awarded funding will be communicated through the Split Letter sent out by NCTCOG
  - Split Letter notifies FTA of the allocation of formula funds

### KEYS TO POP DEVELOPMENT

Only expenses attributable to the urbanized area are eligible

Subrecipients: Requests should account for capital expenditures through 2025

Subrecipients: List of anticipated procurements will need to be submitted before award if requesting funding for project administration and capital projects

Subrecipients: Procurement timelines, 3-5-year Capital Improvement Plans, and Architectural statements for Intelligent Transportation Systems projects

### **Transit Strategic Partnerships Program: Funding Sources**

FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION (FTA) apportions Sections 5307 and 5310 program funds to our region

#### Non-competitive (formula)

About 98% available annually to transit provides through Program of Projects (POP) process

#### **Competitive**

By RTC policy, about 2% is set aside for transit projects that support long-range mobility plan goals and address needs outlined in Access North Texas



# Transit Strategic Partnerships Program: Program Elements/Eligibility

Competitive funding program to support transit project ideas and implement new and/or expanded services that address Mobility 2045 Update goals and Access North Texas.

Eligible applicants	Transit authorities Public Transit providers Non-profits (encourage partnership with an existing transit provider)	Project elements	Cannot be used for operating shortfalls. Service must be within the Dallas-Fort Worth-Arlington and Denton-Lewisville Urbanized areas
Eligibility	Must be an entity that can receive federal funds		Encourage partnerships and collaboration between non-service providers (non-profits) and transit providers
<b>Project Length</b>	Typically a 2-3 year pilot


# Transit Strategic Partnerships Program: Program Evaluation Criteria

CATEGORY	<b>POSSIBLE POINTS</b>
Needs Assessment Address Access North Texas, Transit Studies, Transit Dependent Populations, Environmental Justice, and/or Accessibility. Is it non-duplicative?	60
<b>Strategic Value and Innovation</b> Is it an innovative project that serves an immediate need? Could it serve as a model to other areas?	15
<b>Project Funding and Sustainability</b> Are budget assumptions sound and reasonable? Meet minimum funding requirements? Local match identified? Sustainability?	15
Implementation Capacity and Collaboration Include coordination with stakeholders and existing providers? Does the agency have the required capacity to implement?	10


# Compliance Snapshot

- Comparison of compliance on procurement reviews between 2022 and 2023
  - **Compliant**: no revisions were necessary to procurement documentation to determine compliance
  - **Technical Adjustment**: minor adjustments were needed to clarify provided documentation
  - **Compliance Deficiency**: compliance communication was issued to address missing documentation, process steps, pre-approval, etc.
- Process Highlights:
  - Increased pre-approvals & 3 step review
  - Meetings to review compliance deficiencies


**2022 Procurement Compliance**

#### Procurement Highlights

- FTA Published an Updated Clause Matrix, December 2023
- Required Clauses:
  - Trafficking in Persons, 2 CFR § 175.15
    - Applicability: 1) Each award where funding is provided to a private entity, 2) Grant or cooperative agreement to a State, Local Government, Indian Tribe, or Foreign Public Entity, if funding could be provided under the award to a private entity as a subrecipient.
  - Notice to FTA and U.S. DOT Inspector General of Information Related to Fraud, Waste, Etc.
    - Applicability: All procurements \$25,000 or more.



# Clause Language – Trafficking in Persons 2 CFR § 175.15

PERFORMING PARTY agrees to comply with all applicable provisions of 2 CFR §175.15. AGENCY NAME, the PERFORMING PARTY, and its subcontractors are prohibited from (i) engaging in severe forms of trafficking in persons during the period of time that the award is in effect; (ii) procure a commercial sex act during the period of time that the award is in effect; (iii) use forced labor in the performance of the award or subawards under the award. The Federal award agency may unilaterally terminate the award, without penalty, if the PERFORMING PARTY (i) is determined to have violated an applicable prohibition; (ii) has an employee who is determined by the agency officially authorized to terminate the award to have violated an applicable prohibition of this award term. AGENCY NAME must notify the Federal award agency immediately if any information received from the PERFORMING PARTY indicates a violation of the applicable prohibitions.



#### Clause Language – U.S. DOT Inspector General

Notice to U.S. DOT Inspector General. AGENCY NAME must promptly notify the U.S. DOT Inspector General in addition to the FTA Chief Counsel or Regional Counsel for the Region in which AGENCY NAME is located, if AGENCY NAME has knowledge of potential fraud, waste, or abuse occurring on a Project receiving assistance from FTA. The notification provision applies if a person has or may have submitted a false claim under the False Claims Act, 31 U.S.C. § 3729, et seq., or has or may have committed a criminal or civil violation of law pertaining to such matters as fraud, conflict of interest, bid rigging, misappropriation or embezzlement, bribery, gratuity, or similar misconduct involving federal assistance. This responsibility occurs whether the Project is subject to this Agreement or another agreement between AGENCY NAME and FTA, or an agreement involving a principal, officer, employee, agent, or Third-Party Participant of AGENCY NAME. It also applies to subcontractors at any tier. Knowledge, as used in this paragraph, includes, but is not limited to, knowledge of a criminal or civil investigation by a Federal, state, or local law enforcement or other investigative agency, a criminal indictment or civil complaint, or probable cause that could support a criminal indictment, or any other credible information in the possession of AGENCY NAME. In this paragraph, "promptly" means to refer information without delay and without change. This notification provision applies to all divisions of AGENCY NAME, including divisions tasked with law enforcement or investigatory functions.





#### PROVIDER FEEDBACK: Desired Improvements



During demos, it would be helpful to have a more hands-on experience rather than just observing the company's software expert navigate the system.



Staff at different agencies are having to manually intervene with what should be automatic booking processes because of capacity/overbooking issues.



Via integration with other apps, and specifically the GoPass app, could be better. There are also ongoing conversations on how fare payment should be handled on the Via apps.



Bulk pricing from TNCs should be available and trip quantity in the region should be leveraged for a better rate.

#### PROVIDER FEEDBACK: Goals and Observations

Comingling paratransit and microtransit is being explored across the region.



Group procurements or contracts would be appreciated by some agencies.



New software platforms have been useful for streamlining the booking process and ADA rider eligibility process for several agencies.

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Agencies are not ready to fully integrate into one regional app. However, several agencies are open to a regional transit plan, pass, and/or fare structure in the future.



All agencies want to make the rider experience and system transfers more streamlined and cohesive across the region, especially for elderly and disabled riders.

- How would the shared value of trips between agencies be ideally split if they were all under one system?
