




Regional Safety Position, approved by the Regional Transportation Council, December 14, 2017 and reaffirmed on February 14, 2019



What is a Roadway Safety Plan?

A Roadway Safety Plan provides a framework for identifying, analyzing, and prioritizing roadway safety improvements on local roads.

It serves as a guide to identify crash factors which contribute to a high number of fatal and serious injuries.

Appropriate safety projects and countermeasures are then selected.



Next Steps - Prioritize Safety Projects, Programs, and Policies

Develop a list of high-priority safety improvement projects scheduled for implementation. This considers both high-crash locations and system-wide analysis. Note that this step will occur after the Roadway Safety Plan itself is completed.

Main Tasks within the final step of the Systemic Safety Analysis

- 1. Create decision process for selecting countermeasures
- 2. Develop safety projects, programs, and policies
- 3. Prioritize project implementation

ENHANCE SAFETY

- Improve the safety of the statewide transportation system for all users, including controlling texting while driving, eliminating driving under the influence, lowering excessive speed limits, reducing aggressive driving, reducing the number of fraudulent paper tags, and improving bicycle and pedestrian safety
- Reduce distracted driving through measures such as the use of hands-free cell phone technology
- Oppose legislation to increase freight truck weight limits above 80,000 pounds
- Support legislation allowing sponsorships to support roadside assistance programs
- Eliminate deferred adjudication for safety related traffic violations (e.g., traffic violations in construction zones are not eligible for deferred adjudication)
- Allow non-sworn police officers to complete crash reports and clear minor, non-injury traffic crashes


