### Amy Callaway

- What is 2-1-1?
  - One stop shop for resources
    - Bills, food, childcare, employment, etc.
- Owned by Health and Human Services
- Answered 24/7, 365 days a year
- Offers a language line- 150 languages
- Information- What do we mean?
  - Ex: What if you have a granddaughter that needs to get a driver's license? Call 2-1-1 and they can talk you through needed documentation.
- Who oversees 2-1-1?
  - o Inform USA
- Resources are updated once a year
- 2-1-1 is in every state in the US.
  - Ohio, Georgia, and Illinois are 75%-90% covered
- 25 2-1-1 Regions
- Strategic Plan
  - When a disaster strikes, they are the ones that list where food distribution and shelters are
  - Keep 2-1-1 informed and then you can direct callers to 2-1-1 call center for information
- If someone has a Texas number they can call 2-1-1 directly
- If you have an out of state number, call 877-541-7905
- Who answers the phone?
  - United Way Greater Houston
- 2-1-1 helps with the below
  - Basic needs
  - Criminal Justice and Legal Services
  - Healthcare and Consulting
  - Mental Health Care
  - Older Adult Services (60+)
  - Veteran Services
  - Disaster Services
- Reassurance and rumor control during emergencies/disasters
- STEAR- Choose option 4, they will do intakes over the phone
- Tracks a callers needs and unmet needs during a disaster
- Emergency Service and Escalation Centers
  - Open 24 hours a day via volunteers

- 2-1-1 is nationwide, including Canada
- \*\* UNITED WAY AND 2-1-1 ARE NOT THE SAME THING!!
  - United Way assists, but call centers receive calls from all over the state
  - They may not provide the same services
  - Federal, State, or Local funding provided to United Way is then provided to local agencies
  - No direct services are given by United Way

  - Voter registration systems
  - Voting equipment
  - o Technology infrastructure, electronic poll books
  - Storage facilities
  - Ballots
  - Voting locations
- Concerns
  - Civil unrest
- CISA Regions
  - o 10- We are region 6
- All services offered by CISA are voluntary
- Current threats
  - o Physical-violence
  - o Operational-Foreign Influence Operations/Generative AI
  - Cyber- Ransomware/DDoS attacks
- CISA.gov/protect2024
  - o Assistance with election security

- Kaufman County- Can you assist with election planning?
  - Yes
- What if multiple polling stations are out, do you have contingency plans?
  - Every County is responsible for contingency plans
  - o Think big- What if something happens at 5 different polling locations?
- How do you handle voting with what happened with hurricane Helene? How does that effect the election process?
  - When Sandy hit NJ, they had counties wiped out. They were able to implement laws on the spot for alternate procedures.
- Homeland Security Grant funding requires election security projects-What are projects cities can do to protect infrastructure other than physical location?
  - Accessing those funds- get security assessment form CISA for free.
  - Gives options for additional security to assist with applying for that 3% funding
- Do you talk to poling locations that the County picks?
  - If you're the owner of a public building- public schools included- shall be included per Texas law as polling stations.
- Are you guys working with 2-1-1 to mitigate some of the rumor control?
  - We do have rumor vs reality resources
  - 2-1-1 is happy to work with CISA to assist in rumor clarification

- COG
  - Nonprofit Security Program Grant opening soon
